From The Mayor's Desk Charles R. Amrich, Mayor

Here we are, summer is over and the kids are back to school. Summer sure went by fast. I hope residents enjoyed our 'Concerts in the Park' and 4th of July picnic and parade, Lakefest and of course fireworks. It has been my pleasure to talk with our residents at these functions and so nice to see residents enjoying our fine Village.

The Village is combining two boards into one. The Zoning Board of Appeals is combining with the Planning Commission. This is being done to simplify issues that would require both boards to meet on a particular issue. This is not an uncommon thing in Villages of our size. The new Board will have members from both of the previous boards and should function quite well. The hard part was picking the members to serve on that committee. Our Village is very fortunate to have residents with the talent and the ability to get involved in our local government.

As an elected official I am concerned and encourage our residents to let your elected Village officials know if you have any questions or suggestions about any Village issues.

One particular issue is the proposed power plant in neighboring Oakwood Hills. As some of our residents will remember in 1999 there was a proposal presented to our Village to build a power plant on the property that is now Walnut Glen Estates which is located off of Dowell Road.

We did extensive research on the effect a plant would have on our Village. Real estate values and way of life issues were considered. Above all concern was the tremendous amount of water it would be taking out of the same aquifer where the Village draws water. The Village Board unanimously rejected the proposal.

The Village Board passed a resolution on August 14, 2014 in opposition to the proposed power plant in Oakwood Hills. I received calls and letters from residents of Island Lake who are concerned. They also encouraged us to oppose the proposed power plant. I thank our residents for their input on this important issue.

Back to School:

Safety tips for motorists

School buses are one of the safest forms of transportation on the road today. The reality of school bus safety is that more children are hurt outside the bus than inside as passengers. Most of the children who are injured in bus-related crashes are pedestrians who are hit by the bus or by motorists illegally passing a stopped school bus. For this reason, it is necessary to know the proper laws and procedures for sharing the road safely with school buses.

School buses use yellow flashing lights to alert motorists that they are preparing to stop to load or unload children. Red flashing lights and an extended stop sign arm signals to motorists that the bus is stopped and children are getting on or off the bus.

Illinois law requires that traffic in both directions stop on a two-lane roadway when students are entering or exiting a school bus.

The area 10 feet around a school bus is where children are in the most danger of being hit. Stop your vehicle far enough from the bus to allow children the necessary space to safely enter and exit the bus.

Be alert. Children are unpredictable. Children walking to or from their bus are usually very comfortable with their surroundings. This makes them more likely to take risks, ignore hazards or fail to look both ways when crossing the street.

Never pass a school bus on the right. It is illegal and could have tragic consequences. If you are convicted of illegally passing a stopped school bus, your driver's license or vehicle registration will be suspended for three months and you will pay a minimum \$150 fine. Be advised that vehicles that are in violation of school bus stop arm laws are reported to the Police Department.

Make a COMPLETE stop at all stop signs and WATCH YOUR SPEED! The speed limit on most residential streets in the village is 20 MPH unless otherwise posted.

Lastly, be alert for any suspicious people or activity at bus stops. Children under 10 should be supervised by a parent or guardian while waiting at bus stops and should call 911 immediately if they observe any suspicious people or activity.

October 5-11 2014, is **Fire Prevention Week**, and this year's message is "Have 2 Ways Out." As a way to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire of 1871, Fire Prevention

Week has been observed since 1922 during the week that encompasses the date of October 9. Although Chicago has the best known fire on that date, the Peshtigo Fire in Wisconsin also started on that very same day. It was the most devastating forest fire in American history with 16 towns destroyed, 1,152 people killed, and 1.2 million acres scorched. Fire Prevention Week is a commemoration of both an urban conflagration and a wildland fire. It is important to have a home fire escape plan that prepares your family to think fast and get out quickly when the smoke alarm sounds. What if your escape route is blocked by smoke or flames? That's why having two ways out is such a key part of your plan. This year's theme, "Have 2 Ways Out," focuses on the importance of fire escape planning and practice. Once we are outside, the family should all have a meeting place, such as a mailbox away from the house, or across the street, so the family knows everyone is together and who might be missing. Once you are out, STAY OUT!

Please remember to change your smoke detector batteries during fire prevention week as well. This is very important, because if your smoke detector doesn't work, how will you know you know there is a fire and need to get out?

Landscape Waste Collection Program

This program runs from April 1 to November 30. There is an additional cost for this optional program. If you wish to have this service, call Waste Management to sign up 800-796-9696. Or you can purchase individual stickers from the Island Lake Village Hall or local merchants. One sticker is required per-bag, per-can, or per-bundle instead of one flat fee per season. Contact the Village Hall for complete information on participating merchants. Stickers can also be ordered directly from Waste Management over the phone and they will be promptly mailed to you.

Please note:

If you use cans for your landscape waste instead of the biodegradable Kraft paper bags, please paint a large red X on the cans containing landscape waste. This will help identify the landscape waste to the drivers so your pickup is not inadvertently missed.

Also, if you use stickers for your landscape waste bags or cans, please make sure the stickers are visible to the waste haulers from the street.

Brush and Tree Trimmings

Bundled brush is included with the optional yard waste program. If you are not in the subscription program you must attach a sticker to each bundle.

They must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string in distinct piles that are no longer than 4 ft. in length, 2 ft. in diameter and weighing no more than 45 lbs. with no individual branch being greater than 3" in diameter.

Excessive brush and leaves on a property can greatly increase the risk of fire and pest type animals. It is a code violation which will be enforced, so please keep your property clean.

Public Works & Water Dept

The Public Works and Water Department had a very busy summer. While many of the projects we anticipated were completed, unfortunately we weren't able to get to everything on our list, and a few projects will have to be rescheduled for next spring.

Fall is the time when Public Works begins to switch gears in preparation for the changing season. This fall we will concentrate on tree trimming and readying our snow removal equipment for winter.

We also want to welcome our new Public Works and Water director. He's been on the job for nearly a month, and already Brian Bartnick, Island Lake new public works and water director, has gotten his feet wet. Brian helped the community deal with installation of 150 feet of 8" diameter water main on Hillside Dr. due to a water main break and he's on top of developments related to the community's upcoming public works and water projects.

"There's a lot I'm still feeling out and getting used to. But so far so good," he said. "I really like it here."

Dartmouth Drive Water Main Replacement Project

The Island Lake Water Department has accepted a bid from Maneval Construction Company Inc. for the construction of 1,355 lineal feet of 8" and 6" diameter water main, 900 feet of service pipe on Dartmouth Drive (to serve about 32 homes). The project will include 4 new fire hydrants, 1 new water main valve and surface restoration. The new main will replace existing 6" main that have repeatedly failed. The project will start at the beginning of August. The Residents will be kept abreast on the project via hand carried notices and mailings.

The Water Department has been busy repairing water services that froze this winter.

Hello Residents & Friends,
Enjoying the hot summer weather? Make everyday count as we are fast approaching fall & you know the rest of the story. Let's start to think about planning (leaves starting to fall/proper raking technique. Winter just the thought of snow/proper shoveling technique/snow blower safety). Apply thinking with a list of task (buying a good

ergonomically designed snow shovel/a good quality snow-blower...safety first. Keep hands/feet away from all moving parts when operating/ladder safety) as you complete make a check on your list being completed. A reminder: Severe storms are still popping-up from time to time, remember: Monitor all sources of weather/sirens (local news weather, weather channel & weather radio/abs). Seek shelter at once if potential risk.

The Island Lake, Lake Festival was a big hit for our community. The emergency management team assisted the Island Lake Police Department with traffic support on Route 176 & safely instructed/guided parking during the entire event. I would like to send a special thanks to our team members: Georgia RE, Dan Curtiss, Bob Boa, Tim Briody, Chris DeFontane & Keith Johns/Public Works on behalf of the Village of Island Lake Emergency Management Agency. Community Safety is our commitment to the residents and our friends. Please remember to keep an Emergency Preparedness Kit on stand-by (bottle water, first-aid kit, non-perishable foods/canned, a good flashlight, blankets, matches/lighter, a tool-kit, etc., add as you need).

On behalf of the Village of Island Lake Emergency Management Agency, I want to thank our volunteers for their dedication and support. *As a reminder our Emergency Management Meetings are held the 4th Wednesday of the month at the Village Hall at 7:00pm.* Volunteers are welcome, we only ask that you commit and remain active as a member by taking part in training exercises and support Village functions. Our next meeting will be held on Sept., 24th 2014.

The EMA Team supports our Police, Fire and Public Works Departments within our specific training protocol. Our mission is safety and having the proper training to support our Village.

Before and After School Club 2014-2015

The Village of Island Lake offers a Before and After School Club program at Cotton Creek Elementary School during the school year. The morning program runs from 6:30 a.m. to 9:05 a.m. Monday through Thursday, and 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. on Fridays. The afternoon program runs from 3:40 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. A light snack is served in both the morning and afternoon program. During club hours your child will participate in a variety of activities including homework time, games, sports, and free time. To register for this program, please visit the recreation office at the Village Hall. A \$30 non-refundable registration fee will be required at the time of registration. Tuition will be discounted when you have more than one child enrolled. After your initial registration, all monthly tuition may be dropped off in the Club payment envelope, mailed to the Village of Island Lake, dropped off at office, in drop box located on the front door of the Village Hall, or paid online. All cash payments must be made in person. We are not responsible for cash payments that are dropped off. The following tuition schedule is based on 179 school days divided by nine months. Your tuition amount remains the same each month regardless of days off of school. During non-attendance school days, we also offer a full-day program 6:30 a.m. to 6:00p.m. at the Village Hall. Field Trips and activities are planned for these days. An additional fee of \$35 a day is required for all day care and extra fees for field trips will also be added on. Advance registration is required.

16th Annual Venetian Night


September 6, 2014
