With all the snow and cold winter weather it is nice to see the sledding hill in Converse Park getting a work out. Also our lake is being used by many ice fishermen.

This letter is to disclose what has been discovered with regard to the Village of Island Lake's financial status. It is not a rosy picture but I feel it is important to give you the facts as we currently know them so everyone can see what has transpired in the past three budget years 2010-2011, 2011-2012 and 2012-2013.

As you may know the current Village Board changed auditors since the election and our current auditor is completing its audit of the May 2012-April 2013 fiscal year. Our Village finances are not as good as we were led to believe going into the spring election. Annually, the Village levies and collects real estate taxes for Police Pension fund. By law, these funds cannot be used for any other purpose and each year must be paid to the Police Pension Fund. This was not done. From 2011 through the spring of 2013, the last Village administration failed to distribute a total of \$388,539 to the Police Pension Fund. Instead, the funds were left in the general fund and unlawfully used to pay general bills, including legal bills. Thus, this sum is now a debt owed by the Village to the Police Pension Fund. The following chart recaps the issue:

Imagine my shock! Now we need to somehow repay this debt.

I want transparency in our Village government. That is why this important issue is being brought to your attention. Rest assured we will tighten our belts, as much as possible, without reducing Village services. The current Village administration has properly made the current fiscal year (May 2013-April 2014) payments to the Police Pension Fund. We are investigating liability and possible alternatives to repay the money owed. The Village Board will be working with the Police Pension Board to work out a payment solution that works for both of us.

I am sure some of you have some questions as to how this was allowed to occur. I would encourage you as a resident of Island Lake to feel free to address any questions to the Board and myself at Village Board meetings. We will provide you with whatever information and answers we have at the time.



Vehicle stickers were due on February 14, 2014. They must be affixed to your vehicle(s) in the lower right hand portion of your windshield by that date. The vehicle sticker fee helps pay for road repairs and upgrades on a local level, just as monies from your license plate purchases do on a state level. The police

department will be strictly enforcing this ordinance beginning on March 1, 2014.

The police department's radar speed trailer is now back in operation. The trailer has not been used for the past several years because repair parts could not be located due to the age of the trailer. After a long search, the parts were located and the trailer was repaired by our own Island Lake officers. The speed trailer will be deployed at various locations on village streets, weather permitting.

March, 2014 Primary: Voting Information

The offices to be nominated at the General Primary Election include County Clerk, Sheriff, Treasurer, Regional Superintendent of Schools, County Board Members Districts 3,6,8,9,10,17, and 19 and North Shore Sanitary Trustees Districts 3 & 5. Precinct Committeemen for the two political parties, and city of Lake Forest Alderman will also be elected at the General Primary Election.

In an effort to minimize the costs associated with voting, the Lake County Clerk's office has decided to combine voting sites for early voting. Beginning with the March 2014 primary, early voters in Wauconda Township will be served at the Lake Barrington Village Hall, 23860 N. Old Barrington Road, Lake Barrington. Early voting sites will be open Monday thru Friday from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. starting Monday, March 3 until Saturday, March 15th.

On behalf of Connie Mascillino, our past Emergency Management Coordinator (with many thanks), I will continue lead-role in keeping our Village Safe & Prepared for any-type emergency we encounter.

Our Emergency Management Meetings are held every 3rd Wednesday of the month at the Village Hall at 7:00pm. The first meeting will be held: January 22, 2014. Volunteers are welcome, we only ask that you commit and remain active as a member taking part in training exercises and village support functions.

The EMA Team supports the Police & Fire & Public Works Departments within our training protocol. Our first and most important to all members: is their safety and having the training to support our Village in a time of need.

Water Department

David Court and Hyacinth Terrace Water Main Replacement Project

Seventy-five percent of the residents have completed water service hook ups to the new main. Just a reminder, the deadline to complete these hookups is August 18, 2014. If you have any questions, please call us at 847-526-1954 and we'll be glad to help you out.

Dartmouth Drive Water Main Replacement

The engineering design and Village budget work is underway. After the Village completes the budget process, construction should begin in 2014. At this time no formal decisions have been made. We will keep the residents in the area informed via mail or hand carried letters as decisions and time frames become established.

Winter Safety Tips

- Beware & Cautious of using space heaters, carefully read all UL safety tip before operating.
- Keep all Smoke Detectors and Carbon Dioxide Detectors with good fresh batteries.
- Make sure all vents and chimneys remain free of obstruction to allow proper air-flow.
- Never warm up the car in the garage, carbon monoxide fumes are deadly.
- When using extension cords, only use UL rated cords that meet UL standards.

Regulations:

- If shoveling snow, be cautious of using your back. Apply proper shoveling technique pushing the snow forward then lifting with your legs & a quick-toss.
- Apply salt when needed for icy slippery surfaces, use kitty-liter for traction.
- When walking avoid slippery walk ways and high traffic areas.
- Check in on loved-ones, family and friends especially when temperature fall below zero.
- If you have non-insulated water pipes and the temperature drops below freezing, let the faucet- trickle as this will prevent the pipe from freezing most of the time.
- Please drive safely especially during these winter months, give yourself plenty of time to arrive at your destination safely.

Lake News

Happy New Year from the Lake Management Committee!

IT'S ICE UP! Please be VERY careful when on the lake and use caution when you are on the ice. Please DO NOT approach open water and be especially precautious of black ice, soft spots and slushy areas.

Have you noticed the new "LAKE MANAGMENT" tab on the village website? The Lake Management Committee has been working hard so we can keep you up to speed about the lake. With a simple click, you'll get current information such as: water quality, advisories, weed spraying, beach closings, special events, etc. To better understand the goals behind our fishery and to clear some misinformation, we have also dedicated a tab on the website labeled, "Sensible Restrictions." Within, you will find information pertaining to the non-resident discussions and our focus.

For the Anglers: Island Lake has adopted revised regulations for slot and daily creel limits. This information is available at the Island Lake Village Hall and is posted at Eastway Park as well as other locations around the lake. Below is a handy reference chart. You can simply cut it out and keep it with you!

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources has been scheduled by the Lake Management Committee to conduct a current fish survey this spring. Once the survey is completed, the regulations will most likely be adjusted, so please keep an eye out for changes in the slot and daily creel limits later this year.

There has been misinformation about the goals of the Lake Management Committee (LMC) their focus on the fishery. It implies the LMC is trying to stop non-residents from fishing Island Lake or using our parks and beaches. **The is FALSE information!**

The truth behind the proposal currently being worked on by the LMC is looking to limit fishing accessibility with respect to non-residents while UPON the waters of Island Lake. The key word here is UPON. this means on a boat or upon the frozen waters (ice) during the winter months. All parks, beaches, islands, boat launches and piers will remain 100% ACCESSABLE FOR ALL NON-RESIDENTS to use under the proposal. We will also continue to welcome non-residents to participate in special events such as fishing derby's that will be held on our lake.

Our focus is to the fishery and protecting our lake for future generations. We are proposing non-residents be accompanied by a resident of Island Lake in order to harvest fish from our waters or fish UPON the waters. We also understand there may be certain circumstances were you (the resident) could not accompany your guest, so the committee has talked about the possibilities of purchasing (optional) guest tags for these circumstances.

As a resident, you pay a premium in your taxes to have this gem of a lake in your town. Residents also pay to maintain the lake, stock the fish, spray for weed control, maintain the boat launch, the pier, our parks and even lake patrol by the Island Lake Police Department. This is a community investment and a privilege for our residents. Although we are a community of friendly people, we are not a careless community. Therefore, by asking non-residents to be

considered as guests it will help prevent over harvesting and illegal possession of fish from our waters. Being pro-active instead of reactive, will also help eliminate aquatic invasive species potentially entering our lake, which could result into tens of thousands of dollars to address.

We have been appointed to the Lake Management Committee and entrusted with making our lake a number one priority. These plots are filled entirely with compost donated from Midwest Organics on Darrell Road and will make your plants grow like a weed.

Victory Garden Guidelines Spring of 2014

1. A fee of \$ 25 will reserve you plot. At the end of the season, \$10 will be refunded when your plot is cleaned out.
2. The garden plots will open in spring and may be kept planted until October 31
3. The plants in each garden plot should be kept within the bounds of the plot to keep paths clear.
4. Weeds will be kept under control in the garden plot and immediate area surrounding the plot.
5. If a garden plot is expected to be kept as weed free as possible. The plot may be forfeited if not maintained.
6. If you are unable or no longer want to keep up the garden or need help please notify the Village Clerk so that we can arrange help or give the plot to someone else.
7. The garden plot and surrounding area will be kept clean of trash and litter.



8. Gardeners must only pick their own crops unless given permission by the other gardener.
9. Fertilizer, insecticides and weed repellents cannot be used that will in any way affect other plots or the surrounding areas.
10. Water is available to all gardeners from the large drum located next to the garden- please do not over water or leave the spigot running.
11. No pets are allowed in the garden.
12. Children must be supervised in the garden.
13. No alcohol or tobacco products are allowed in the garden.
14. Dead plants, weeds and other plant material may be deposited in the compost bin on site or removed from the site. Please do not dispose of plant material in trash cans.



Animal Control Regulations

RUNNING AT LARGE It shall be unlawful to permit any dog or cat, whether licensed or not, to run at large within the village. A dog or cat shall be deemed to be running at large when off the premises of its owner and not controlled or restrained by a leash, cord, chain, or lead or within the premises of its owner or confined within a crate or cage or confined within a vehicle or on the premises of another person with the consent of that person. The charge for impounding and keeping an animal is \$25.00/day.
