From the Mayor's Desk



I would like to keep our Village residents informed on matters that could affect your commute to and from work in the near future. The State of Illinois has slated two projects slated for construction in 2018.

The first project is at the Route 176 and Roberts Road intersection. The

State will construct a right turn lane to southbound Roberts Road. This should alleviate some of the eastbound backups that occur on a daily basis.

The second project involves resurfacing of Route 176 from Roberts Road in Island Lake, eastbound to Larkdale Row in Wauconda. It will go out for bid this fall for the work to be done in the 2018 construction season.

Both the Roberts Road turn lane and the Route 176 resurfacing projects are funded by the State of Illinois.

We will use our marquee and our website to provide construction updates so you can plan for traffic delays—including updates from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) as we receive them.

On Saturday, December 23, you will see familiar folks from the Village ringing the bell for this year's Salvation Army Red Kettle collection. Our residents have always stepped up to help families in need.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many volunteers and donors who help make our community a better place to live. Through generous contributions of time and money, we have events, beautiful gardens, a historical society and boat tours of our namesake lake..

On behalf of myself and the Village Board, I wish you a Merry Christmas and a Happy (and healthy) New Year.

- **Missed pickup:** Call within 24 hours.
- **Large item pickup:** One per week at no cost; for additional items, call to arrange payment on the Friday before pickup.
- **Yard Waste:** Purchase stickers at the Village Hall, Island Foods or Walgreens and place them on the bag or container—or sign up for Prairieland's seasonal pickup. *Yard waste pickup up is available April—November.*
- **Wet paint prohibited:** Do not place containers with wet paint in the trash.

2018 Vehicle Stickers go on sale on December 1.

Your 2018 vehicle sticker forms should have arrived in the mail by now. New residents, stop by the office for a form.

Stickers must be **purchased** and **displayed** on your windshield **on or before February 14, 2018.**

Happy Holidays from everyone at the Police Department. Here are some safety tips as you do your holiday shopping. Always...

- Park in well-lit areas. Note where you parked your vehicle—especially at a mall—so that you can walk directly to your vehicle.
- Keep your packages out of sight in your vehicle.
- Be aware of your surroundings and keep a watchful eye on your children.
- Do not leave your purse or wallet in a cart! Keep credit cards and wallets in a secure spot on your person to prevent from being a victim of thieves.
- Look around before you use your credit card to make a purchase so that no one can obtain your personal information.



Keep the doors and windows of your home and vehicles locked. Burglars and thieves like this time of year because it's a chance for some easy money.

Slow down and don't tailgate when you drive in inclement weather. It's better to get to your destination late than not at all. You don't want to spend your holidays in the hospital.

If you are going on a holiday vacation, call the department non-emergency number at 847-526-2100 to put your home on house watch. While you are away, officers will periodically check your house.

Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over The Police Department is participating in a DUI enforcement effort and is giving a fair warning to holiday revelers: **Keep the party off the road.** The *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* and *Click It or Ticket* enforcement efforts are made possible by federal traffic safety funds administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation.



The ILPD is now an official OfferUp MeetUp Spot. The MeetUp Spot is outside the Police Department entrance and is under video surveillance 24x7. OfferUp is a mobile marketplace for local buyers and sellers. The program goal is to eliminate the exchange of items at a residence. Having a designated public meeting place can help deter criminal intent and activity.

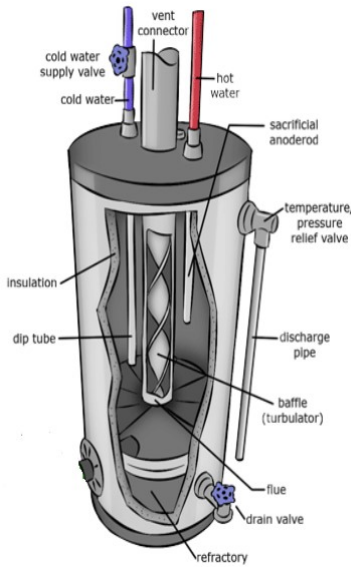
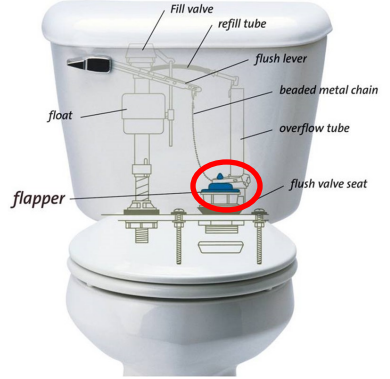

Water Department-Patrick Stewart, Water Superintendent

2017 Water Main Project Ethel Terrace and Oak Terrace were scheduled to begin construction this past summer to replace the water mains; however complications with the permitting process with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency stalled the project. It is now scheduled to begin early spring of 2018. We apologize for the delay. We will keep the residents in the area informed via mail, hand-carried letters and, as always Newsletters, as decisions and timeframes are established.

Water Bill Seem High? In September of this year the service charge and water rates were increased to help ease some of the costs the Village has endured for repairs needed, and will endure for future projects such as a new well, water tower, and treatment plant—to name a few. Also, a large number of residents had running toilets in their home recently. It doesn't seem like a running toilet could use a whole lot of water; however we have seen *running toilets waste as much as 300,000 gallons in a 3 month period!* Please check your toilets, replace the flap drain (as circled on the right) in the back of the tank at least every 2 years to prevent a leak.



Hot Water Issues Do you ever experience discoloration, odor or low flow when taking a shower or using hot water at any of your faucets? Do you ever hear crackling in your hot water tank when it tries to heat? This is normally a sign that requires your water heater be flushed. Over time, your hot water tank collects and builds sediment from naturally occurring minerals that will usually rest at the bottom of the tank. Not only does this cause water quality issues, but it also forms an insulator at the bottom of the tank. This forces the heater to work harder and requires more time and energy to heat your water! Most manufacturers recommend flushing your tank annually. Flush your tank today!

Winter is Coming! Cold is approaching quickly. Residents living in the original part of town—especially those with crawl space access on the outside of their home—this is your chance to seal, insulate, heat and cover everything possible to prevent water lines from freezing. The smallest drafts can freeze plumbing inside your home, typically overnight when water is not in use.

DOs and DON'Ts of Snow Removal

- Do not shovel, blow or plow snow onto the roadway. Village ordinance prohibits placing snow onto the cleared roadway.
- Park your vehicle off of the street when it starts to snow. This allows crews to clear the entire roadway and prevents the car from being plowed in, ticketed or towed.
- Try to clear snow around fire hydrants. This simple step could save precious time in emergencies.
- Remove portable basketball hoops, benches and decor from the street right-of-way. The Village is not responsible for damage to these items resulting from snow removal operations.
- Check that your mailbox and post are in good repair and that they are behind the curb, not leaning out over the street.

Public Works broke ground on a new public works building last month that will house the Village's public works equipment and vehicles.



Snowfall Protocol As we switch gears to winter operations, I remind you of how Public Works operates when the weather takes a turn for the worse in the winter. The weather in our region can change in an instant; therefore Public Works also has to make the appropriate changes to deal with a particular snow event. Our number ONE goal is to keep the roadways safe for your travel, at all times. While we are striving to clear the roadway of snow and ice, there are several things that you, the homeowner, can do to help make our task easier and more efficient.

Arterial streets are priority, for example: Eastway, Burnett, Waterford Way, Hale Ln., Newport Dr., Carriage Hill and Westridge Dr.

Public Works will repair only mailboxes *HIT by the snowplow*. The post and the box should be strong enough to withstand the weight of snow from the plow.

The piling of snow on the roadway is Village ordinance violation.

Parking on the roadway during snow removal is prohibited.

The plows are out there to make your travel safe; please show them courtesy.

Year 2018 Community Development Block Grant Funding

The Community Development and Housing Grant Commission made a formal recommendation to the McHenry County Board for approval of 2018 funding in the amount of \$184,800.00 for the Village to resurface Fern, Hyacinth and Circle Dr. N.

Building Department – Wayne Schnell, Commissioner

When the mercury drops below freezing, it's a sure sign that winter is here.

Safety Tips for the season:

- Use extension cords and/or power strips sparingly and *never* for a heating device. They should be safe and properly rated for their load.
- Check all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors for proper operation.
- Seal air leaks around doors and windows. Clean your furnace and dryer vents.
- Disconnect all hoses from outside spigots and store them away. Even though a spigot may be freeze proof, it can still freeze and burst if a hose is connected to it.
- Clear snow and ice from ALL vehicle windows before driving. NO texting while driving.
- Keep outside steps and walkways clear, falls are a major cause of not staying healthy.
- Do not deposit snow on roadways.
- Do not leave pets outside too long.



A few reminders...

Rental Registration is required for all residential rental property within the Village. Registration forms are available at the Village office or online here: <http://villageofislandlake.com/forms/>

Permits are required: A permit at a minimal fee of \$55 is required for replacement of a furnace, central air conditioner or water heater. The fee includes a final inspection of the installed unit. A permit is also required for a “roll off” dumpster on residential property at a fee of \$50—but *not required for temporary “pod” type storage units.*

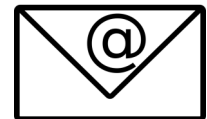

Lake Management Committee – Ken Wick

Winter is a great season to adventure outdoors in our largest park: the lake. Here are a few tips to help you enjoy our lake safely and courteously.

Use caution on the ice. Keep away from open water and slushy areas. The lake does not freeze instantly when temperatures drop. Remember: *dark ice is often NOT safe!*

Shovel an ice-skating rink or small area on the lake. The Lake Management Committee encourages you to make clear spaces for the sunlight to penetrate and create healthy oxygen levels in the water. This is especially important during the winter months; even a small cleared area helps. The smaller bays are most affected in the winter.

Avoid skating rinks and shoveled areas when you drill ice-fishing holes or operate snow-mobiles. These areas are maintained for the enjoyment of ice-skating and hockey.

Follow the Size, Slot and Creel Daily Regulations (see 4-9-1 from the *Village Code*, below) to provide a sustaining fishery for future generations. Regulations are also available at the Village Hall.

4-9-1 Size, Slot and Daily Creel Regulations

Permitted harvesting of fish from the waters of Island Lake located within the Village of Island Lake shall be limited in accordance with the following written regulations which shall be made available at Village Hall and posted at the Eastway Park Boat Launch.

Hello Residents and Friends,

The temperature has dropped, the days are shorter and the sun sets shortly after lunch. "My friends" winter is just around the corner...let's start thinking about a winter safety.

Remember.... Please Check your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors, install new batteries and replace a faulty unit.

For snow shoveling: Make sure you have a sturdy shovel with a long handle to minimize the stress on your shoulders and lower back. Snow-Blowers work best, doing the heavy work with efficiency and speed. Read all safety instructions and manuals before you operate the equipment.

Remember to clear the side walk for our kids and residents walking to and from the bus stop on the street. **Please be cautious.**

The Island Lake EMA Team supports our Police Department, Fire District, Public Works and Parks and Recreation Department with traffic support and community service that helps our community stay safe. I would like to thank my team for their dedication and support. **Community Safety** is our commitment to all the residents.

Plan appropriate and take proper steps for winter-safety. Prepare a winter safety kit for your home and your vehicle in case of a snow storm with large accumulation or a power-outage/ice storm.



The Home Winter Emergency Preparedness Kit should contain the following: bottled water, first-aid kit, non-perishable foods, a good flashlight, blankets\comforters, spare batteries, matches/lighter and a toolkit with can-opener.

The Winter Emergency Car-Kit should contain: jumper cables, shovel, gloves, blanket, LED-type flare/standard flare/flash light.

The Emergency Management Meetings are held the 4th Wednesday of the month at the Village Hall at 7:00pm. Volunteers are welcome.

Our mission is community safety within the guidelines while obtaining the proper training to support our village in the event of a disaster/emergency call-out.

The Holiday season is upon us and we have much to be thankful for.

A friendly reminder to change your smoke and CO detector batteries when you change your clocks for daylight savings. If your alarm is going off without reason, simply read the back for instruction. Typically, smoke and CO detectors need to be replaced after 5-7 years. Your local hardware store should have an ample supply on hand.



If you are decorating for the holidays, please do so safely. Real trees need A LOT of water. *NEVER* have an open flame near, on or around a real tree. Do not overload electrical extension cords or run them under carpet. Make sure your lighting has a label from an independent testing laboratory. Remember to turn off all of your decorations before you leave your home or go to sleep at night.

Holidays bring colder weather and the use of wood stoves and fire places. These are wonderful to use this time of year, IF you have had them cleaned. Chimney fires are extremely common at the start of this time of year. Have your chimney cleaned by a professional; it will not only give you piece of mind, but could potentially save your family and home. Last—but certainly not least—make an escape plan with your entire family and practice it.

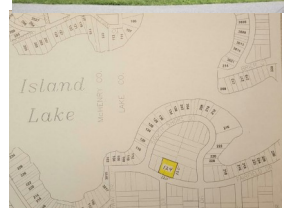
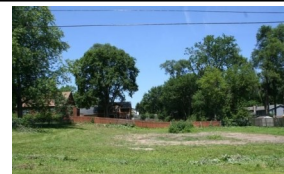

Frequently Asked Questions about:

Garbage Pickup

Q: When is the next curbside electronics* recycling pick up?

A: Monday, April 2, 2018. *Please note: Only 1 television per year is allowed.

Q: What do I do if I have a large item for pickup?

A: *One bulk item*—for example: couch, (if a sectional, 1 piece per week), table, or mattress or box spring (not both)—can be put out per week. As a courtesy, please contact Prairieland first! (phone # below) Note: Please consider donating items in good condition to your favorite charity.

Q: Will appliances—for example: refrigerator, stove, washer/dryer—be picked up?

A: For an extra fee and by pre-arrangement, Prairieland can pick up appliances. They will accept them at no charge if you take them to 21N988 Pepper Road in Barrington during regular business hours.

Q: What should I do if my garbage wasn’t picked up?

A: Call Prairieland within 24 hours: 847-381-9300.



Billing

Q: How can I find out my garbage or water bill balance if I misplaced or didn’t receive my bill?

A: Call the Village Hall at 847-526-8764. Bills come out quarterly. If you haven’t received one in a while, it’s a good idea to call.

Permits

Q: What do I need to provide to get a building permit?

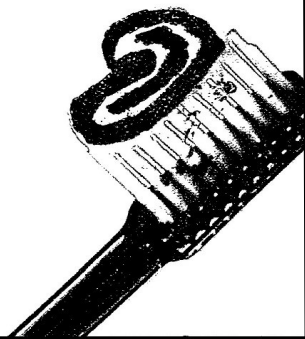

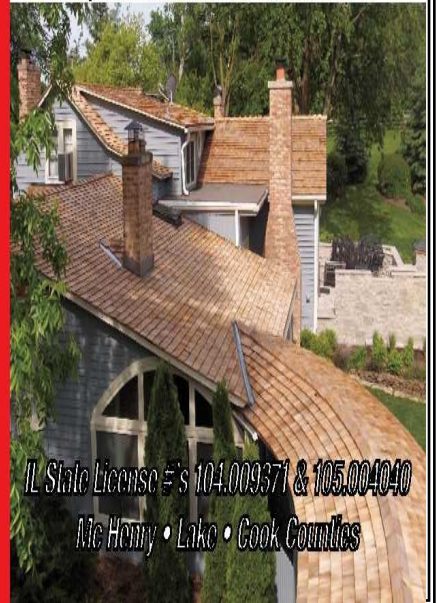
