### What Projects Require a Building Permit?

By Village of Island Lake Ordinance, a Building Permit is required for all new construction, alterations, replacement, or repairs such as, but not limited to, the following:

- Additions and basement build-outs.
- Paver patios and walkways.
- Decks and porches.
- Concrete slabs, patios and sidewalks.
- Demolitions of any structure.
- Dumpster in residential area.
- Driveways and parking lots.
- Electrical new or upgrades (Copper wire and metal conduit is required.)
- Plumbing new or upgrades
- Seawalls, docks and piers.
- Fireplaces and fire pits.
- HVAC new or upgrades. Furnaces, A/C units and water heaters.
- Fences, garages and sheds.

- Gazebos, screen rooms and pergolas.
- Kitchen or bath remodeling that involves structural and/or utility changes.
- Roofing, gutters and downspouts.
- Siding, fascia and soffit.
- Windows and doors.
- Signs and flagpoles.
- Swimming pools and hot tubs.

Permit fees are based on the project value (\$50 minimum). Plan review and/or inspection fees may also apply.

### **Permit Requirements**

#### **Homeowner Association**

Many Homeowner Associations require approval for exterior changes prior to issuance of a building permit. Check with your association before applying.

#### Contractor Requirements

All contractors need to be registered with the Village of Island Lake

- Contractor Registration form
- Certificate of insurance
- Copy of license.
- Payment is due before permit is issued.
- General Contractor Registration fee is \$75. All other Contractor fees are \$50.

Roofing and plumbing projects require a contractor to be licensed by the State of Illinois. Electrical contractors need to be licensed by an approved jurisdiction.

#### **Building Permit Application**

After the HOA and contractor information is submitted, submit a permit application. Include a copy of the contractor's contract describing the project and cost. A plat of survey, detailed drawing with material list and other construction documents may also be required.

## Lake Management

Lake Management Committee

First and foremost the LMC would like to give an Epic-Sized Thank You to our Public Works Dept. They have been instrumental with the progress our lake has made this year, especially with the duckweed harvesting. Along with LMC members and resident volunteers, we have collected approximately 100,000 lbs. of duckweed, and we are still going! Duckweed can easily quadruple in less than a summer season. When you take that into consideration, it would be nearly a half a million pounds still floating around if we did nothing. That's almost unfathomable to think of how much weight that is. Now, with what we have collected, there will be much less of a chance to see the same invasiveness this time next year.

Another Special Thank You to Midwest Organics. Not only do they graciously donate the organic compost for our community gardens and pumpkin patch, they also take the harvested duckweed we have collected at no charge to the Village of Island Lake. Then they turn it into a renewable compost to use again. That's a good neighbor to have!! Thank you again Midwest Organics.

Have you seen the new pier at Eastway Park? It is now 5 ft. wide and handicapped accessible. We have received good feedback from residents and users alike. Part of that feedback asked us to keep several of the poles taller on the pier, which allows a handhold when entering and exiting boats.

The erosion mat at the boat launch has been installed as well! These steel mats (known a PSP mats) are a US Military surplus, once used in WWII and Vietnam as landing mats for aircraft in unstable soil conditions. Lately, the PSP mats have been utilized across the country as boat launch ramps to stabilize the ground and help prevent further erosion into the waters. It's a great benefit to recycle these mats and help prevent further erosion.

Finally, as a continuation of a long-term goal to eventually start dredging in areas of our lake, the first step is shoreline stabilization. We were able to install two smaller natural stone seawalls last year at Park Beach and Briar Beach. This fall, we will be installing approximately 165 ft. of steel seawall at Channel Park along the creek that brings water into our lake. We hope, one day, we can do the other side of the creek as well, which will then allow us to start a dredging project improving our waterway. Again, this is years down the road, but all the pieces need to be put in place. Slowly but surely we are making progress.


