Chief of Police - Anthony Sciarrone

As winter weather fades, days get longer, and the warmer weather is right around the corner, **don't forget about safety first!** You and your family's safety as you enjoy the upcoming season is the number one priority of the Island Lake Police Department. We do this by promoting safety through both Education and Enforcement. Over the next four months, our officers will use focused enforcement to address the following initiatives that impact the safety and happiness of Island Lake residents:

Hands-Free While Driving: Talking and Texting: On January 1, 2014, Illinois banned the use of all hand-held electronic devices while driving. The violation carries a \$75 fine for the first offense and is considered a moving violation for second or subsequent violations. Only "hands-free" technology such as speakerphones and wireless headsets are permitted. Please keep in mind that this also includes holding phones while using them for GPS. As the days get nicer and longer, pedestrian and bicycle traffic will significantly increase the odds of a



potential tragedy. Aggressive initiatives such as Safety Zone Enforcement Areas will be established to send distracted drivers a clear message: "Don't drive in **TEXT**icated!"



Click It or Ticket: The Island Lake Police Department is participating in a federally funded grant, along with the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Illinois State Police, in a campaign to help prevent the loss of life through seat belt use. During this grant period, extra officers will be patrolling and enforcing seatbelt laws. We will also be looking for drunk or drugged drivers and other traffic violations 24/7, with a large number of patrols occurring during the late-night hours when the most unbuckled and impaired fatalities occur.

Contact Police Department for Overnight Parking: When out-of-town family plans to visit for a few days, there may not be room in the driveway for extra vehicles. As per our village ordinance, there is no parking of any vehicles on any streets in the Village of Island Lake between the hours of 2 A.M. and 6 A.M. The Village allows residents up to 14 grace days for street parking each year to help with these special circumstances. If a resident needs to park a car on the street, call the Island Lake Police Department's non-emergency number 847-526-2100 to request overnight parking permission.

Provide the following information: 1) Resident's full name, address and phone number,

- 2) Location where the vehicle (s) will be parked (if different from resident's address),
- 3) Number of vehicles to be parked and 4) License plate number of each vehicle. Residents who receive overnight parking permission are still required to park legally on the street; do not block fire hydrants or driveways, park left wheel to curb or where signs prohibit parking.

Let's all work together to keep Island Lake a safe and friendly place to live!

Ordinance 7-2-3B requires purchase and display of 2017 Vehicle Stickers by 2/1517. Citations issued for failure to purchase and display will not be voided.

2017 Hydrant Flushing Schedule

The Village of Island Lake Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants* from 8:00 AM to 3:30 PM during the following schedule:

Fox River Shores Subdivision: April 3rd through 7th

Westridge Subdivision: April 24th through 28th

Waters Edge Subdivision: May 5th through 12th

Portens Subdivison: May 22nd through 26th

Walnut Glen/Fen View: June 12th through 16th

Original Section: June 26th through 30th



*Residents are advised to use caution before laundering clothing as hydrant flushing can stir up naturally occurring minerals that can stain fabrics. Signs stating Hydrant Flushing will be placed in each subdivision prior to work start.

2016 Water Main Service Connection Reminder: The deadline for residents on Burnett Rd. who are required to hookup to the new water main is **August 23rd**, **2017**. We would like to thank all residents for their patience and understanding in our efforts to add new and replace old, deteriorating water mains to create a better product for everyone.

2017 Water Main Projects: The engineering design and Village budget work is underway for next year's water main replacement projects. Plans are to continue replacement on the North/South streets off Burnett Rd. between Midway Dr. and Cedar Terr. At this time, no final decisions have been made. We will keep the residents in the area informed via mail, hand carried letters and—as always—Newsletters as decisions and timeframes become established.

Where is Your Water Shutoff Valve?

Do you know where your main water shutoff valve is inside your home? This valve is of high importance, and can be the difference between a small leak and major water damage. Most main valves are located right before your water meter and should be exercised at least annually. Older valves, in particular "gate valves" have a tendency to quit working after years of nonuse. Check your valves today!



We know that potholes are a significant issue for people getting around the Village of Island Lake, especially in the winter and spring. Our goal is to keep the unfilled pothole requests at a steady


low number.



What causes a pothole? Over time, cracks will develop in pavements and allow water, ice, and incompressible into the pavement structure. The material under the pavement may begin to erode, causing the pavement




weight of traffic. In many instances, this process may cause potholes to develop overnight where none may have existed.





- 1. The pothole is off the side of the road. Sometimes potholes form on the side of the road where drainage is poor and the area is used for parking. If the pothole is in the Village's right of way we will repair it.
- 2. It can't be repaired through simple pothole-patching. Some defects that are reported as potholes are really some other kind of problem that can't be repaired the same way as a pothole. Sometimes the road is rutted or rough, a possible void or sink hole, or a crumbled street. This requires a longer-term fix and is submitted for a major repair.
- **3. The pothole may be on a state-owned (non-Village owned street)**. IDOT owns several streets within the area and have their own procedures for repairing potholes.

The best thing a citizen can do is report a pothole and slow down when crews are patching them.

Building Department – Wayne Schnell, Commissioner



Happy Spring! **Please check our website for projects that require a permit** and information regarding the permit process.) Click on the *Departments & Village Board* tab, then *Building/Code Enforcement* to find the information)

Take a walk across the street and turn around to see what others see. Trim your trees and bushes. Lawns should be kept less than 8" and shrubbery trimmed. We use the International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) and it doesn't cost much to keep your property clean and organized.

Driveways and front lawns should not be used for storage.

Items of concern are trash containers, ladders, snow plows and inoperable vehicles. Boats on trailers that are not used for the season need to be stored indoors or outside the village limits.

Clean your gutters and apply paint where needed. Please note: Placing a dumpster on your property for any reason requires a permit.

If everyone pitches in to keep their property clean and organized home values will increase.

Enjoy the warmer season and keep safety in mind.

New Water & Garbage Billing Format:



By now you've noticed the water and garbage billing formats have changed and are now being mailed in a first-class envelope. (No more losing the post-cards in the couch cushions!) Thank you for your patience while we are learning the new software, and we hope to work out the kinks that are typical in a software conversion.

Remember water and garbage bills are sent every 3 months (quarterly, NOT monthly). Copies of the billing schedule are available at the Village Hall and on the village website.

Emergency Management - Calvin Clay, Coordinator

Happy New Year, Residents and Friends! Another winter bites the dust; I'm glad it's over. Spring is approaching, days are getting longer and the fresh scent of flowers in the air. Are you planning to do some spring cleaning? Plan ahead. Set an achievable goal; work smart but safely. You have the whole summer.

Remember "Spring Forward" and set your clocks hour ahead on March 12th. Replace the batteries in your smoke detector/s and carbon monoxide detector/s to protect your family and pets. Remind your family members and friends.

With spring in the air, the process starts for flowers and trees to begin blooming with the help of spring showers. This season is also known for **storms and sometime severe weather** that can approach fast without warning. Be sure to **monitor the local weather forecast** via the weather-channel/radio/phone app/weather-radio and any other type of communication that monitors severe weather within our area.

When severe weather is forecast, the threat becomes a potential. **Be smart and plan** accordingly in case we are in the path of the storm. **Listen for the tornado sirens**. When you hear them, **take immediate shelter in a safe place** away from windows and monitor conditions until the threat has expired. Move to a community shelter or a basement. In structures with no basements, move to a closet away from doors and objects that can be a hazard.

Have on hand bottled water, a working flashlight, a safety kit and food supplies. Set a meeting place where family members can gather if displaced and a list of phone numbers to check if family, friends and neighbors are safe.

On behalf of the Village of Island Lake Emergency Management Agency, I thank our volunteers for their dedication and support. Reminder: our **Emergency Management Meetings are held the fourth Wednesday of the month at the Village Hall at 1900/7:00pm.** Volunteers are welcome, I only ask that you commit and be an active team member by taking part in all the training exercise and be supportive of our Village functions upon request.

The EMA Team supports our Police, Fire, Public Works and Parks & Recreation Departments within our specific training protocol. Our mission is **Safety for the Village**.



Lake Management Committee – Ken Wick (LMC)

The lake is the Village's Biggest Park! As you have seen over the past few years, the Village of Island Lake has been passionately committed to making our lake better for future generations. A few years ago we invested in a duckweed-harvesting machine (The WeeDoo), we have now a good handle on our duckweed problem. It is a maintenance issue moving forward. Continuing our commitment to make our lake even healthier, cleaner and more appealing, the LMC is looking into Sub-Surface Aeration Systems.

What is a Sub Surface Aeration System? Simply put, it's a specialized air compressor that will deliver millions of air bubbles per hour into the water.

Why do we need it? By aerating our lake from the bottom up, the circulation created eliminates the thermocline (water separated into multiple layers based on temperature). When the thermocline is eliminated, oxygen is allowed to the lake's bottom more easily. This creates a perfect environment for a naturally good bacteria called "Aerobic Bacteria" to thrive. With the help of these bacteria, the water column will become clear while reducing the muck and sediments off the lake bottom.



Our long term plan is to install subsurface aeration systems in several areas of the lake. We hope to start with Forest Bay, and updating Circle Bay's outdated aeration unit. The systems we designed are expected to turn over the water 3X per day in each bay. There should be a noticeable difference in water quality within the first several weeks of the system starting up. We will keep you posted on future systems for our lake.

It's also that time of year when we start to make our lawn and yards look pretty. Products you put on your lawn can make their way into our lake—even though you may live many blocks away from it. The phosphorus found in many fertilizers can travel through our watersheds easily.



<u>PLEASE USE PHOSPHORUS FREE FERTILIZERS</u>! You can make a difference and help protect our lake when you buy it. Look for three numbers on the bag. For example: 14-12-10.

- The first number is the percent of Nitrogen; nitrogen makes your grass grow great.
- The middle number is the amount of phosphorus, a nutrient that is not good for our lake. This number should be **ZERO** (0) for phosphorus free fertilizer.
- The third number is the percent of potassium, another nutrient.

Boating season is approaching. Remember to **buy your lake use stickers** (available at the Village Hall) and **do a quick safety check of your boat and equipment** to assure you're safe on the water. All fishing regulations, creel and size limits are posted at all beaches, in the lake handbook and at Eastway Park boat launch. Please report any suspected abuse of overharvesting.

Lastly, **thank you to LMC member Paul Meindl** for his dedication and commitment over the years. He has contributed his time, efforts and professionalism to the LMC and we wish him well moving forward in his endeavors.

Before and After School Club 2017-2018



The Village of Island Lake offers a Before and After School Club program at Cotton Creek Elementary School during the school year. The morning program runs from 6:30 a.m. to 9:05 a.m. Monday through Thursday, and 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. on Fridays. The afternoon program runs from 3:40 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. A light snack is served in both the morning and afternoon program.

During club hours your child will participate in a variety of activities including homework time, games, sports, and free time.

To register for this program, please visit the recreation office at the Village Hall. A \$30 non-refundable registration fee will be required at the time of registration. Tuition will be discounted when you have more than one child enrolled. After your initial registration, all monthly tuition may be dropped off in the Club payment envelope, mailed to the Village of Island Lake, dropped off at office, in drop box located on the front door of the Village Hall, or paid online. All cash payments must be made in person. We are not responsible for cash payments that are dropped off. The following tuition schedule is based on 179 school days divided by nine months. Your tuition amount remains the same each month regardless of days off of school.

During non-attendance school days, we also offer a full-day program 6:30 a.m. to 6:00p.m. at the Village Hall. Field Trips and activities are planned for these days. An additional fee of \$35 a day is required for all day care and extra fees for field trips will also be added on. **Advance registration is required.**
