I would like to let our residents know that the \$400,000 debt owed to the Police Pension Fund has been paid in full.

The final \$50,000 payment was made this June. (A previous administration incurred the debt by using the pension fund money to pay other bills.) In our efforts to be fiscally responsible with your tax dollars, we have repaid the fund over the past 4 years.

On another note, we will be doing a considerable amount of street resurfacing this year. We have budgeted \$500,000 for this resurfacing. We are going to do some of the worst roads first.

We know there are many roads that need resurfacing but we can only do so much with the funds we have budgeted. Please bear with us. We are already planning for next year's resurfacing projects.

I would like to say, "Thank you!" to Debra Jenkins for her service as a Village trustee. She and Greg have moved out of town and she will be missed for her generosity and dedication to our village.

School has started. Please be careful driving and watch out for children and the school buses.

Vietnam Wall Replica Traveling through the Area on September 27th

"The Wall That Heals", a half-size replica of the Washington DC Vietnam Wall, will pass through McHenry and Lake Counties on September 27th on its way to a temporary display area in Des Plaines. The wall will leave McHenry County VFW Post at 10:00 a.m. and will travel at 25 mph along the following route: Rte. 120 to Rte. 12 (Rand Rd.) to Quentin Rd. to Rte. 14 (Northwest Hwy.) to the Lake Park Pavilion in Des Plaines. Viewing will be open to the public 24 hours a day from September 27th to October 1st.





DEAR RESIDENTS

The Village of Island Lake is committed to providing a safe and reliable supply of high quality drinking water at a sensible price. However, the cost to keep clean water flowing into our homes and work places has risen considerably and will continue to rise.

Every year the Water Department continually replaces outdated, broken or under reading water meters. This has decreased lost revenues and helped to maintain equity in water billing throughout town. The Village also abandons and replaces approximately 500-1000 feet of deteriorating water main every year, thus reducing the cost of repeated repairs and water loss. We will continue to examine all aspects of our operations to improve efficiency without jeopardizing the quality of service.

Due to inflation, rising utility costs, increased mandates introduced by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, replacement of the water distribution system in the original section of town, and a rise in maintenance costs incurred for aging infrastructure and equipment, the Village Board has approved an increase in water rates effective September, 2017.

Since 2004, the Village has increased its water rates just once (2015) at approximately 2.6%: raising the rate from \$3.70 to \$3.80 per thousand gallons used, with no increase in the service charge of \$24.00 per quarter.

Effective September 2017, water rates will increase 10%. The current rate of \$3.80 will become \$4.18 per thousand gallons. In addition, the quarterly service charge will increase by ten dollars for residential customers, bringing it to \$34.00. (Commercial rates are also increasing accordingly.)

The senior discount of 20% will still apply to the quarterly service fee only.

The increase is essential to cover the costs of needed upgrades such as a new well: costing as much as \$300,000, a new elevated storage tank: (water tower) costing as much as \$2 million, and a new treatment facility: costing as much as \$4-9 million. These numbers have the ability to increase or decrease depending on location, elevation, and water quality. The Village has allocated \$100,000 for the 2017-2018 budget period to begin engineering and surveying for the above mentioned items.

According to a Municipal Water Rate Survey taken between March-April 2017 consisting of 16 surrounding water supplies, the average 10,000 gallon water bill based on quarterly (3 month period) billing came out to \$82.70. With the new rates beginning September 2017, a 10,000 gallon water bill in the Village of Island Lake will cost \$75.80, well below the average of surrounding towns.

We at the Village realize any increase for any service can have a strong impact on our residents and businesses and is not taken lightly. However just like any other product, costs do increase, and running a water system is no exception. We thank you for your understanding and support in our goal to keep delivering you the best water product possible.

GARBAGE BILLING CHANGE

Effective September 2017, the quarterly garbage bill will increase to \$52.00 (from \$50.50)—an annual increase of \$6.00. Seniors (65 years and older) will continue to receive a 20% discount, making the quarterly senior bill \$41.60—an annual increase of \$4.80.

2016 Water Main Service Connection Reminder NOTE for residents who were part of the 2016 Burnett Rd. water main project: You were required to hook up to the new water main by August 23, 2017. If you have not hooked up to the system please contact the Water Department. We would like to thank all residents for their patience and understanding in our efforts to add new and replace old deteriorating water mains to create a better product for all residents.

2017 Water Main Projects Engineering design and Village budget work is underway for this year's water main replacement projects. Plans are to replace approximately 835 feet of water main on Ethel Terrace and Oak Terrace off of Burnett Rd. We will keep the residents in the affected areas informed via mail, hand carried letters and—as always—Newsletters as timeframes are established.

Water Meter Replacement Water department staff replaces water meters throughout town on a regular basis—most often due to an old meter failing to translate readings to our equipment. Meters are also replaced in order to upgrade old equipment to the new radio style that allows us to read a specific area in half the time. In these cases, residents are sent letters by mail or door tags are left requesting that they let us in their home for a brief period of time to make the replacement. We are asking you, the resident to please call and make an appointment with the water department if you receive a letter or door tag. Failing to do so may result in an estimated, inaccurate, potentially higher bill. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Heavy rains may cause minor street flooding in the Village, as the storm sewers sometimes aren't able to keep up.

As many of you have contacted the department recently regarding the storm sewers. I would like to explain that as much as the Public Works crew works on unclogging and maintaining the storm sewers, during heavy rains and floods, the ground is often saturated.

Sewers can also become overtaxed during intense rain events when the sheer volume of stormwater and wastewater entering the system fills them to capacity, leaving no space for excess water to enter. In this condition, described as a sewer being surcharged, the excess stormwater remains above ground. water, this flooding can flow off the street into below-grade areas such as driveways, patios and basements.

Day to day, the department works to keep our system up and running efficiently. We clean and maintain our sewer and drainage systems to keep them in a state of good repair. Please be aware that the sewers work properly but cannot keep up with the additional flow generated by heavy rain storm.

Please, please, please...

The Village asks residents: Do not blow grass clippings and leaves into the street or down storm drain inlets. Grass clippings and leaves end up in the nearest river or plug local storm sewer systems.

While we are still working on some of these projects we must start to prepare for the inevitable weather changes to come. As the upcoming fall season is beautiful here in Island Lake, it can create some problems for this department. After the leaves have fallen from the trees they tend to accumulate in the roadway and at times covering the storm sewer basins, which could create a problem with rainwater drainage. We make every attempt to keep the drains clean for adequate stormwater removal, if you happen across a drain that is covered with leaves please contact this office so that we may avert a potential problem. As this is written it is 85 degrees and sunny; old man winter seems a million miles away. We will be busy readying our snow removal equipment very soon for the upcoming season, and finalizing some of the numerous projects. With this in mind, now is the time to examine your mailbox condition and location.

It is this departments policy to replace/ repair the mailbox ONLY if it was directly hit by the plow, not from the snow that comes off the plow. There are several things to look at to make sure that your mailbox is sturdy enough to handle the weight of the snow:

Is the post sound?

Is the box itself mounted securely to the mast arm?

We have had our share of hot and rainy days this summer. I welcome my favorite time of year.... FALL.


Here are some safety reminders:

Properly store away any yard equipment or watercraft.


Outdoor burning is only allowed with seasoned firewood. No paper or plastic products. No branches, leaves or yard waste.

Lake Management Committee – Ken Wick



Wow, have we had the rain! All that rain brings torrents of water into our watershed. This runoff flows into our namesake lake, Cotton Creek Marsh and also the Fox River. Within that runoff, the water is filled with phosphates—chemicals often found in lawn fertilizer that are bad for our waterways. The Village Board with direction of the Lake Management Committee wants to reduce pollutants. Following the coattails of 12 plus other communities within Lake County, we have recommended the ban of phosphate fertilizers on our lawns. Phosphate free fertilizers can be found at most retailers. On each bag of fertilizer, there will be 3 numbers. That middle number is

the phosphates. When you purchase a bag of fertilizer with the middle number being "0" you are getting phosphate free fertilizer. Our watershed extends for miles around our village. Doing your part in purchasing phosphate free fertilizer will help our waterways for future generations.

Note: We ask all residents to use phosphate free fertilizer. Whether you live on the lake or on "inland", runoff from your property gets into our lake.

We WON! The Village of Island Lake is the recipient of a \$10,000 grant provided by the ComEd Green Region Grant! These funds will be utilized to improve our newest park next to the dam ~ Hyde Park. Most of the funds will be used to install a natural stone seawall. The other improvements will include native plants and grasses, a walking path along the lake, benches and some pine trees. Thank you to Trustees John Burke, Sandy Doehler & LMC Chairperson Ken Wick for writing and applying for the grant. Thank you to Christine Beeson for her artistic rendition that was submitted with the grant application. And of course, thank you to ComEd! Watch for these improvements to take place later this year.

Hello Residents and Friends,

Hopefully, we have seen the last of the rain. Due to the significant volume in such a short timeframe, our Village and surrounding neighbors experienced increased, record water levels in our lakes, rivers and streams. The mosquito population multiplied. Be sure to empty and dispose of any stagnate water containers where mosquitos can breed (let's all do our part). Keep the mosquito repellent on hand. Let's imagine the beautiful fall colors of nature just around the corner (falling leaves and a proper raking technique to avoid a sore back).

Remember: A severe storm can still pop-up anytime. Monitor all sources, weather/sirens (local news weather, weather channel & weather radio/weather apps). Seek shelter at once if potential risk of severe weather is reported.

The Concerts in the Park, Lake Fest and the July Fireworks were spectacular. Our Emergency Management Team is dedicated and well appreciated as we provide support in our community and assistance to our neighbors if needed. This includes the Island Lake Police Department with traffic support on Route 176 at Veteran's Park during our community events to safely stop traffic, then safely allow the residence to cross the street and instructed/guide parking. 

The above article is from the Fall issue of the 1943 Island Lake News. The plaque, which hangs today in the Village Hall, was presented by the Village of Island Lake to the Island Lake Woman's Club in 2013 on the 70th anniversary of the founding of the club to honor their philanthropic service.

Formed in 1943, during World War II, the Island Lake Woman's Club was dedicated to serving the community, including corresponding with our residents in the service, and founding a small lending library. Of course today our little library is no longer necessary, and every resident of Island Lake has access to the entire Northern Illinois Library District. However, our work continues today, still serving the community by supporting local libraries and schools, the Wauconda/Island Lake Food Pantry, the House of Hope Pet Food Pantry, the Salvation Army, Canine Companions, the Veterans Administration, the Heart Fund, Smile Train, Heifer International, and the American Indian Center in Chicago, all in addition to planting and maintaining two of the garden entrance gates to the Village.

Victory Garden Fall Maintenance by Mary Schuman

Early mornings at the garden in August foretell the coming fall season. Heavy dew sparkles on the leaves and dill like diamonds. Heavy dew also helps fungus to grow. Maybe this is nature's way of letting us know it is "brown bag" season. It is wise to pull out plants that have stopped producing or have gone to seed. They take nutrients from the soil. Doing a little cleanup at a time eliminates messes and spending precious time late October.

Reminder: All garden waste is to be put in large brown waste bags, rolled closed and left behind the water tank. Take pride in your garden plot. All will look beautiful for the many visitors that will be coming to the park for Fall Festival on October 7th.

If you decide to completely remove plants, it is best to turn the soil. Heavy rains have compacted the dirt. It is a good time to add soil amendments/nutrients when turning the dirt in fall. Gardeners who will be returning to the same plot may want to consider this approach.





Final cleanup and closing is Oct 28th at 9:00 AM. Bring clippers, rakes and brown bags. If you want to reserve your plot for 2018, stop by that morning or call me 847-487-5448 and get your name on the reserve list.


