From the Mayor



The Village Board and staff have been working on our budget for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. Of course, each department has budget requests and we should be able to handle most of the usual projects and needs with our anticipated revenues. For

example, police protection, public works services and road projects are ongoing needs.

In addition to the regular, ongoing annual budget needs, we periodically have "big ticket" items and projects that have a cost beyond our fiscal year budget dollars. The Village water system needs additional water storage, an additional well and additional water treatment facility. Bonding will be needed to finance these projects.

Your Village Board will be working with bond counsel and other professionals to determine costs and financing options. When we have gathered the information about options and costs, we will conduct several public meetings to share information about why we need these Improvements to the water system and what the options and costs are and to answer residents' questions.

We will keep you informed about the water system improvement project through our newsletter, our website, our marquees, social media and other avenues available so that residents have an opportunity to have their questions answered at one of these public meetings.

I thank you for your attention to this important matter.

As a reminder, Section 7-2-1 of the Village Code states that a **vehicle sticker is required** for "Any vehicle that is registered to any person residing at an address within the village." The sticker must be displayed on the lower right side (passenger side) of the windshield. Citations will be issued for failure to display the Village sticker even if it was purchased. Affix the sticker to avoid a fine!



There is no parking on any village street from 2:00 am – 6:00 am. To request permission to park a vehicle on the street overnight, please call 847-526-2100 and choose option #8. The Sergeant or Officer in Charge will get the necessary information so you won't receive a citation.

Island Lake has a leash law. **Make sure your dog in on a leash** every time you take your pet for a walk. Keeping your dog leashed makes everyone safer, including your dog.

Water Department — Patrick Stewart, Water Superintendent



2018 Water Main Projects

The engineering design and Village budget work is underway for this year's water main replacement projects. Plans are to continue replacement on the north/south streets off Burnett Rd. between Midway Dr. and Cedar Terr. Ethel and Oak Terrace—scheduled to be replaced last year but delayed due to IEPA permit issues—should resume this year.

Plumbing “Need to Know” for Homeowners

Plumbing in your home is often overlooked. For many it is “out of sight, out of mind,” and until there is an issue such as a leak, some residents would not know where to begin. The **main shutoff valve** in your home is crucial when dealing with a leak; it is even more important that the valve is operational when you need it.

Residents can find their shutoff valves where the water service line enters their home—normally in a crawl space or basement. If your home is built on a slab you should find your valve near your hot water tank. **Residents should also know where their water meter is.** Water meters are normally right next to the shutoff valve and should be kept clean and accessible.

Fear you have a leak? Your water meter can tell you. Simply look at the top of the meter. All of our water meters have a small triangular dial or symbol that spins when water is flowing through them. If you are not using water and you see the dial spinning, you most likely have a leak somewhere. Check your toilets, faucets, and spigots for leaks first. If you still cannot find the leak, call the Water Department. We will assist you as best we can to find the leak.

Building Department – Wayne Schnell, Commissioner



Building and home improvement ramp up in the spring. Here are a few reminders as you plan your projects.

Permits are required for the following:

Additions and basement build outs
Paver patios and walkways
Deck and porches
Concrete slabs, patios and sidewalks
Demolitions of any structure
Dumpster in residential areas
Driveways and parking lots
Electrical new and upgrades (copper wire and metal conduit is required)
Plumbing: new and upgrades
Seawalls, docks and piers

Fireplaces and fire pits
HVAC new or upgrades. Furnaces, A/C units and water heaters
Fences, garages and sheds
Gazebos, screen rooms and pergolas
Kitchen or bath remodeling that involves structural and/or utility changes
Roofing, gutters and downspouts
Siding, fascia and soffit
Windows and doors
Signs and flagpoles
Swimming pools, hot tubs
Dumpsters

Permit fees are based on the project value (\$50 min). Plan review and/or inspection fees may also apply. A plat of survey may be required.

Homeowners Association approval for exterior changes may be required. Contact your HOA.

Contractor registration is required. Fee for general contractor: \$75; all others: \$50.* (*No fee required for plumbers.)

Saturday 8am – 5pm
Sunday and Holidays 8am – 4pm



Rental properties must be inspected and registered with the Village. The fee is \$50 per dwelling and must be renewed every two years. New tenant inspections are included in the fee.

Inspections are also required for Real Estate Owner Transfers (OTI). Additional fee for re-inspection: \$30.

Driveways and lawns must be maintained and free of clutter. Grass should be less than 8" and shrubbery trimmed. Trash containers, ladders, snow plows or inoperable vehicles should not be stored driveways.

Emergency Management – Calvin Clay, Coordinator

Spring is known for spring showers and blooming trees and flowers. This season is **also known for storms and severe weather** that can approach fast without warning. Monitor the local weather forecast via the weather-channel/radio/phone app/weather-radio and any other type device of communication that provides updates on severe weather in our local area.

Be smart and plan accordingly when severe weather is forecast. Take the threat seriously. Listen for the tornado siren to alert you that we are in the path of the storm. Take immediate shelter in a safe place like a basement. If there is no basement, move to closet or away from doors and objects that can be a hazard. Monitor conditions until the threat has expired. Have bottled water, a working flashlight, a safety kit and food supplies on hand.

Have a meeting place established where family members can meet if displaced, a list of phone numbers to check on family, friends and neighbors to be sure of their safety.

On behalf of the Village of Island Lake Emergency Management Agency, I want to thank our volunteers for their dedication and support. A reminder, our Emergency Management Meetings are held the fourth Wednesday of the month at the Village Hall at 1900/7:00pm. Volunteers are welcome; I only ask that you commit and be an active team member by taking part in all the training exercises and support our Village functions upon request.

The EMA Team supports our Police, Fire, Public Works and Parks and Recreation Departments within our specific training protocol. Our mission is Community Safety for our Village.

Lake Management Committee – Ken Wick (LMC)

The Lake Management Committee (LMC) hopes everyone had a great winter!

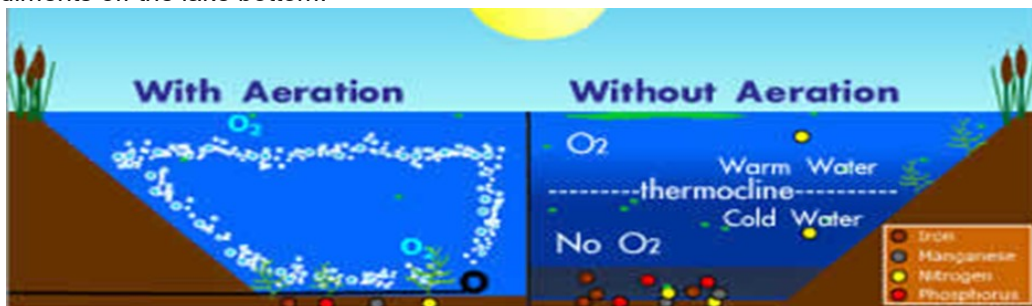
As you have seen over the past few years, the Lake Management Committee (LMC) has been passionately committed to making our lake better and better for future generations. **The lake is the Village's biggest park!** A few years ago, we had a duckweed problem, but with the investment of our duckweed-harvesting machine (The WeeDoo), and a relentless effort by our Public Works Dept., we have a good handle on it now. We hope it is only a maintenance issue moving forward, but it is unlikely that we can ever rid 100%. Continuing our commitment to make our lake even healthier, cleaner and more appealing, the LMC will be installing two Sub-Surface Aeration Systems this spring.

- **What's a Sub Surface Aeration System?**

Simply put, it's a specialized air compressor that will deliver millions of air bubbles per hour into the water, and a water circulation unit.

- **Why do we need it?**

By aerating our lake from the bottom up, the circulation created eliminates the thermocline (water separated into multiple layers based on temperature). When the thermocline is eliminated, oxygen is allowed to the lake's bottom more easily, creating a perfect environment for a naturally good bacteria called "Aerobic Bacteria" to thrive. With the help of these bacteria, the water column will become clear while reducing the muck and sediments off the lake bottom.



In 2018, two sub surface aeration systems will be installed in the Circle Lagoon, the channel leading to it, and Forest Bay. With the systems we have designed, each of these areas are expected to turn over the water 3X per day! There should be a noticeable difference in water quality within the first several weeks of the system starting up. We do expect natural sediments to cloud the water at first startup, but this will clear and dissipate soon after the system is up and running. We will keep you posted on future improvements for our lake.

It's also that time of year when we start to make our lawn and yards look pretty. What you put on your lawn can affect our lake.

PLEASE USE PHOSPHORUS FREE FERTALIZERS!

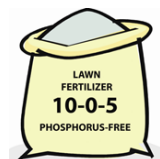
Although you may live blocks and blocks away from the lake, the phosphorus that is found in many fertilizers can travel through our watersheds easily and make its way to our waters.

The fertilizer you purchase has three numbers on the bag. For example: 14-12-10.

The first number is the percent of Nitrogen (This makes your grass grow great).

The middle number is the amount of phosphorus, A nutrient, (not good for our Lake).

The third number is the percent of potassium, another nutrient.



The middle number should read ZERO (0), when you purchase a phosphorus free fertilizer.

So the next time you purchase fertilizer for your lawn, please think about our lake.

You can make a difference!

As the Boating season approaches, don't forget to pick up your lake use stickers available at the village hall. Remember to do a quick safety check of your boat and equipment to assure your safe on the water. All fishing regulations, creel and size limits are posted at all beaches, in the lake handbook and at Eastway Park boat launch. Please report any suspected abuse of overharvesting.

Spring is just around the corner with milder temperatures and the first blooming flowers. Living in the Midwest, we have learned we are not free of that potential freeze and/or snowfall till the end of April. Large bodies of water will begin to melt bringing dangerous thin ice. **PLEASE stay off the ice if we have had a stretch of warm weather.** It can be very deceiving specifically if the weather has fluctuated from freezing to unseasonably warm temps. The only way to guarantee your safety and the safety of others is to **STAY OFF THE ICE.**



Ice Thickness Table for new, clear ice only

Ice Thickness	Permissible Load
2 inches or less	STAY OFF
4 inches	Ice fishing or other activities on foot
5 inches	Snowmobile or ATV
8-12 inches	Car or small pickup
12-15 inches	Medium truck

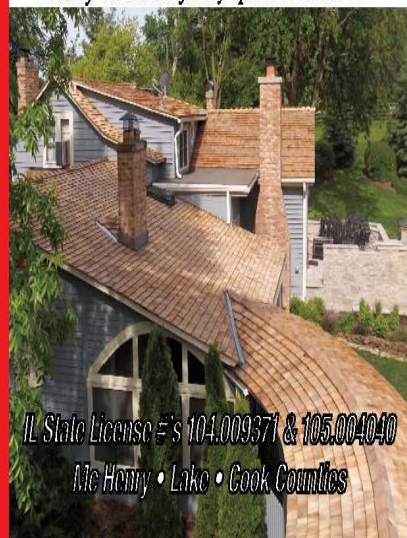
