In the past few years, the Village of Island Lake has acquired additional properties on our lake for the use and enjoyment of our residents. The

property on the east side of the dam and spillway, known as Hyde's Lakeview Park, is one of the best spots for fishing. How do I know? As a young man, I used to fish from there every day in the summer. A *great* spot.

We have also acquired the lots next to the Dorothy Beach. This will allow us to add parking, which gives residents who live farther than walking distance better access. We also plan to make a picnic area to enhance the park.

To cool off on hot days, visit one of our many beaches. In addition to Dorothy Beach, you can enjoy a swim at South Shore, Briar, Park and Veterans Park beaches. Washrooms and a shower area are available inside the pavilion at Veterans.

Our commitment to improve our roads continues. Slated for repaving this year are Carol Circle, parts of Dowell Road, Honeysuckle Drive, Lillian Court, Longacre Court, Neville Road, Newbury Drive from West Burnett Drive to Ilene Court, Ridge Road up to 414 Channel Drive, River Oaks Court, Victoria Drive, Woodland Circle North and Woodland Circle South. Thanks to a grant, we will also resurface Circle Drive North and Hyacinth Terrace.

I hope to see many of our residents at our 2018 Concerts in the Park and at LakeFest. Have a great summer.

## **Chief of Police - Anthony Sciarrone**



Summer is a great time to enjoy the outdoors—including the Village's first rate fireworks display on Saturday, July 7<sup>th</sup>. **Reminder: Leave the fireworks to the professionals**. Fireworks are dangerous; it is against our ordinances (*Village Code* 6-3-3) and against state law for individuals to offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail or use or explode any display fireworks, flame effects, or consumer fireworks.

Spending time outdoors with your pets is another great way to enjoy summer. **Title 6, Chapter 4 of the Village Code contains Animal Control regulations**, including:

- Rabies vaccination requirement for your pets (Village Code 6-4-4)
- If your pet bites someone, notify the police department or county health department immediately. The animal will need to be confined and will need to be examined by a veterinarian. (Village Code 6-4-6)
- Keep your pets under control. When off your property, they must be on *a leash*, cord, chain, or lead. (Village Code 6-4-8)
- Do not allow your pet to leave "deposits" or cause nuisances on any public "thoroughfare, sidewalk, passageway, bypath, play area or any place where people congregate or walk" or enter a place where food is stored, prepared, served or sold. (Village Code 6-4-7) (If your pet leaves a deposit, clean it up.)

Title 6, Chapter 4 also addresses aggressive animals, human treatment of animals and sanitary conditions where animals are kept. You can view all of animal control regulations on our website.

If you are taking advantage of the good weather to sealcoat your driveway, call 847-526-2100 and choose option #8 to request permission to park overnight. **Reminder: Parking is prohibited on Village streets between 2 – 6am.** (7-7-3). Going out of town? Call 847-526-2100 to request that the police department keep an eye on your house.

In answer to a frequently asked question, Yes, police officers can access your property to issue tickets when they have reasonable suspicion of a violation—for example for failure to purchase vehicle stickers.

Please join the Island Lake Police Department in an effort to unite, inform, and protect our community through **Community Watch**.

## Water Department - Patrick Stewart, Water Superintendent



### **2018 Water Main Projects**

Plans are to replace approximately 835 feet of water main on Ethel Terr. and Oak Terr. off Burnett Rd. We will keep the residents in the affected areas informed via mail, hand carried letters and as always Newsletters as timeframes become established.

### **Meter Reading Upgrades**

In the near future, the water department will be replacing existing meter reading devices located on the exterior of homes in Nantucket Village. We are upgrading the meters from manual read to radio read. Residents will see two water department employees walking in their backyards during this process; we apologize for any inconvenience. If you don't recognize them, feel free to ask to see their badges.



### **Toilet Maintenance**

Have you recently received an alarmingly high water bill? In many cases the water department has identified leaking toilets as cause. It may not seem like it, but a leaking toilet wastes large amounts of water quickly. Often, it is very difficult to detect that water is draining out of the tank and into the bowl of your toilet. A leak ¼" in diameter over a 3 month period can waste up to 886,000 gallons of water. Flap valves in the bottom of the toilet tank are most often the culprit; replace them every 1-2 years to prevent unwanted leaks.

### 2017 CCR Coming Soon

The annual Consumer Confidence Report (water quality report) for 2017 will be completed shortly and should be delivered by mid-June. Each resident and business should receive a copy of the report via mail from the Village of Island Lake. Extra copies will also be on hand at the Village Hall upon request. Along with this report will be a survey attached for residents and business owners. We strongly encourage any and all feedback, please drop off the completed survey at the Village Hall.

**Spring Hydrant Flushing Update:** Hydrants in the original section of town will be flushed June 11<sup>th</sup> through 15<sup>th</sup> in the original section of town. This will complete the Spring 2018 schedule.

**Storm water can carry many pollutants**, including (but not limited to): trash, debris, chemicals, nutrients, sediment, metals, oxygen demanding substances, oils, grease and bacteria/pathogens. These pollutants have many sources and varying negative effects on the environment.

Why is storm water runoff a problem? Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into lakes, streams, rivers, wetland, or coastal water that we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. Polluted stormwater runoff can adversely affect plants, fish, animals, and people. Polluted stormwater often affects drinking water sources. This, in turn, can affect human health and increase drinking water treatment costs.

**Sediment** can cloud the water, make it difficult or impossible for aquatic plants to grow and destroy aquatic habitats.

**Excess nutrients** can cause algae blooms. Algae decomposition removes oxygen from the water, harming fish and other aquatic organisms.

**Bacteria and other pathogens** can wash into swimming areas and create health hazards, often making beach closures necessary.

**Debris**—plastic bags, six-pack rings, bottles, and cigarette butts—washed into waterbodies can choke, suffocate, or disable aquatic life like ducks, fish, turtles, and birds.

**Household hazardous wastes** like insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, used motor oil and other auto fluids can poison aquatic life. Land animals and people can become sick or die from eating diseased fish and shellfish or ingesting polluted water.

How can I help? Recycle or properly dispose of household products that contain chemicals, such as insecticides,

pesticides, paint, solvents, and used motor oil and other auto fluids. Don't pour them onto the ground or into storm drains.

**Lawn care:** Don't overwater your lawn, use pesticides and fertilizer sparingly and compost or mulch yard waste. Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.

Auto care: Use a commercial car wash, repair leaks and dispose of used auto fluid at designated recycling locations. Washing your car and degreasing auto parts at home can send detergents and other contaminants through the storm sewer system. Dumping automotive fluids into storm drains has the same result as dumping the materials directly into a waterbody.

**Pet waste:** Pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly; it can be a major source of bacteria and excess nutrients in local waters.

**Drive safely in work zones.** It's road work season and a variety of projects will be underway—including Route 176 and Roberts Road (State of Illinois), River Road at Dowell Road (McHenry County) and various streets in Island Lake.

## Building Department – Wayne Schnell, Commissioner



Happy Summer everyone. By the time this newsletter hits the stands summer will truly be upon us.

Here are some safety reminders.

- Swimming pools: Pools 24" in depth or greater require a permit whether temporary or not. Designate a pair of adult eyeballs to monitor children who are using or near the pool. There must be proper barriers around the pool area.
- Use sunscreen when outdoors, especially the little ones.
- Empty outdoors containers which can hold water outdoors. It seems there is a new virus carried by mosquitos every year.
- Wear a life jacket if you are outside of a beach area on the lake. Little ones should always have a PDF when in the water.
- Do not become distracted while driving.
- · Be extra careful when using ladders.
- Never leave your pet unattended in a motor vehicle.

Building and home improvement ramp up in the spring. Here are a few reminders as you plan your projects.

Keep driveways and lawns maintained and free of clutter. Grass should be less than 8" and shrubbery trimmed. Trash containers, ladders, snow plows or inoperable vehicles should not be stored driveways.

**Remember the potential for severe weather.** Have a safety preparedness plan readily on hand. Discuss it with your family so everyone knows what to do in the event of a severe thunderstorm and or a tornado warning. Listen for the emergency sirens, signaling immediate or fast approaching danger.

A safe-shelter/safety-shelter is most important; take immediate action for safety when severe weather is reported moving in our direction. #### 2018 Yard Waste Pickup FAQs

#### Q: When does yard waste pickup begin and end?

A: Pickup began Monday, April 2.

The last pickup will be Monday, November 26.

### Q: What is the cost for yard waste pickup?

A: \$96.71 is the cost for unlimited seasonal pickup.\*

\*To purchase, unlimited seasonal pickup, call Prairieland at 847-381-9300.

\$2.25 is the cost per sticker for a bag or a bundle.\*\*

\*\* Purchase stickers at the Village Hall, Island Foods, Island Lake Walgreens and Wauconda Ace Hard-

### Q: Is it cheaper to get the seasonal pickup or individual stickers?

A: It depends on how much yard waste you anticipate. 42 stickers cost \$94.50.

If you anticipate using more bags than that, you may want seasonal pickup.

### Did you know...?

If you use your garbage can instead of a yard waste bag, you still need to purchase stickers. You can put food scraps in your yard waste bag or container.



## Lake Management Committee - Ken Wick (LMC)

**AGAIN, this year our Public Works Department, LMC and awesome volunteers** will be back at it! This will take years to duckweed get under control, but we will keep on it! If you see them out there, please tell them "Thank You!" These folks are working hard and the kudos go a long way!



Does your dock, pier or seawall need repair, renovation or replacement? The LMC has been working with our building department to help the aesthetics of our lake. Currently a number of docks, piers and seawalls may need attention. More than aesthetics, our main concern is safety. Our motto is, "if looks unsafe, it probably is." We are asking all lakeside homeowners to do a quick inspection of your dock, pier and seawall. If you have the means to make improvements (which may include just removing unsafe

or unsightly materials), please do so. Also, please remember to check permit requirements.

**2018 starts a new era of safety and patrol for our lake.** Look for our patrol several times a week, staffed by police officers and volunteers. This will ensure public safety, protect creel limits, enforce regulations and

provide assistance and a secure presence.

With safety in mind, we would like remind you of a **new Village Ordinance that requests all of our lakeside homeowners add address (numbers only) in a location visible from the water.** We suggest the furthest point on your dock or pier. If you do not have a dock or pier, we recommend the highest point of your seawall. We

request that the numbers be a minimum of 3 inches tall with a contrasting color to your dock, pier or seawall. Remember not to block your address with your boat! This will help officers identify your home in case of an emergency, for assistance or if you just want to say hello!

**Would you like to receive emails with Lake News?** We are creating an email list as a way to bring Lake News, Lake Handbooks and periodic information pertaining to the lake to your Inbox. You don't have to live on the lakefront; anyone with an interest in the lake can receive the emails. All emails will be sent in a "Blind Copy Format" to ensure your email address will *NOT* be shared with any others. ### **Summer Safety Tips**

Always wear a proper fitting helmet and protective equipment when riding a bicycle, rollerblades, skateboards, and scooters. Bicycles should have reflective markings and proper lighting for night time visibility.

**Create an emergency preparedness kit** in case of incidents such as power outages and flooding. Self-powered flashlights and radios are important to include.

**During severe weather**, follow instruction from the National Weather Service, or local broadcast alerts.

Leave the fireworks to the professionals. Possession of fireworks is dangerous and illegal.

**Never swim alone; children should always swim with supervision.** Children under the age of 13 should have a personal floatation device. **Have a life jacket for every passenger** in a boat.

Make sure your address numbers are visible from the street.

Watch for children at play; drive the speed limit in all residential areas.

**Practice a family fire escape plan**; let everyone know the emergency plan. Specify a meeting place outside the home. **Check that window open and close properly** in case they are needed as an exit.

**Use extreme caution around campfires.** Keep fires clear of all brush and structures. Always have water to extinguish the fire available. Never leave fire unattended.


