## NPDES II (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System)

Any time it rains, a storm sewer system comprised of underground basins and piping carries this water away from the roadway and your home. The conveyance system is quite extensive and requires constant maintenance.

Water pollution degrades surface waters making them unsafe for drinking, fishing, swimming, and other activities. As authorized by the Clean Water Act, the federal National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit program controls water pollution by regulating point sources that discharge pollutants into waters of the United States.

Similar to other communities across the region and country, the Village maintains NDPES stormwater program permit. The Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit issued by the EPA requires that the Village monitor and regulate stormwater discharges throughout the community.
