From the Mayor



"What kind of impact will the roundabout have on our community?" I have been asked by several residents. It is important to understand that the roundabout is located in unincorporated McHenry County-not in the Village of Island Lake. It is a McHenry Division of Transportation project.

At one of the meetings held by the County early

on in the process, the reason given for the roundabout was that it would keep traffic moving safely. I asked, "Why not put a traffic light at that intersection instead of a roundabout?" The answer was that the roundabout will be cheaper in the long run. I find that hard to believe.

The County also claims that the long term costs for maintaining a traffic light are high. Time will tell what additional problems may be caused-or solvedby the roundabout. Meanwhile, you can find information about roundabout safety on the U.S. Department of Transportation website: https:// safety.fhwa.dot.gov/intersection/innovative/roundabouts/.

The Route 176 and Roberts Road turn lane project will be starting soon. This will allow eastbound traffic to have its own lane to turn onto Roberts Road. This Illinois Department of Transportation project should alleviate traffic backups at rush hour.

Speaking of traffic safety... We have stop signs at many intersections throughout the Village to help prevent accidents. Some drivers seem to think stopping at them is not a requirement. I would like to remind everyone that each sign means STOP for everyone.



2018 Water Main Replacement Project

Canyon Construction has been awarded the contract to replace approximately 1000 lineal feet of old 2" water main on Ethel and Oak Terrace with new 8" water main. The work will begin around mid-August. All residents required to hook up to the new water main have been notified, and will be given 1 year from the date of project

completion to hookup. We thank all residents affected for their patience and understanding.

Copenhaver Construction will be relocating approximately 530 Lineal feet of 12" water main along Route 176 and Roberts Road to accommodate the new turn lane to be constructed soon by IDOT.

Keeping our roads safe in all seasons is the #1 goal of Public Works is to keep our roadways safe and clear in all seasons. Here's how you can help as we prepare for fall and winter. •Don't blow or shovel snow from your driveway into the road.

Don't blow or snovel snow from your driveway into the road



•Keep your garbage cans and recycle toters out of the roadway and bring them back to the house as soon as you can after pickup.

•Keep storm sewer drains clear of leaves when you are raking and cleaning up your yard this fall.

•Keep items that may damage or be damaged by the plows away from the road edge (basket ball hoops, landscape rocks, etc.).

It won't be long until you see, or hear, our trucks out in the middle of the night ensuring you a clear road for your travels. Please be aware that the job we are doing also allows the school bus, the ambulance, the police car, and even the UPS or FedEx truck to get to

your home. Do not park cars on the street "when one inch (1") or more of snow has accumulated on said street or when streets are in an iced or glazed condition requiring sanding."



Is your mailbox post secure and strong enough to withstand the weight of the plowed snow? The Village will only repair mailboxes that have been directly hit by the snowplow.

SLOW DOWN and drive safely in work zones. Many road projects will continue into the Fall. Allow extra travel time in high traffic times and watch out for the workers and equipment in the roadway.

What is the only thing that should go down a storm sewer? If you answered *rainwater*, you are correct. To help preserve and improve the quality of our waterways, we need to ensure that the only thing that goes down a storm drain is rainwater. Please do not cover storm drains with debris or dump or wash chemicals, grass clippings or other materials down storm drains. If you notice a problem with a storm drain in your neighborhood, call Public Works.

Grass clippings on the road are a serious hazard—almost like a sheet of ice—for bicycle and motorcycle riders. When you mow, make sure the clippings land in your yard—not on the road. Grab a broom to sweep up any that land in the roadway.

Are your gutters clean and your downspouts diverted away from the house? Make sure leaves and debris won't clog you gutters so melting snow can flow easily and safely away.

Ladder Safety Tips for the Do-It-Yourselfers

• Wear non-slip shoes.

LDING PERMIT

- Make sure ladder is on a flat surface and any latches are locked in place.
- Center you body on the ladder; keep your waist between the rails; maintain a firm grip.
- Face the ladder as you climb or descend *1 step at a time*. Set each foot set firmly before lifting the other.
- If possible, have someone stand at the bottom and hold the ladder while you work.
- While you're on the ladder, move materials with caution to keep your balance and keep the ladder from tipping.
- Follow manufacturer safety instructions. (For example, "This is not a step." means exactly that.)

Emergency Management – Calvin Clay, Coordinator

Our mission is community safety within the guidelines while obtaining the proper training to support our village in the event of a disaster/emergency call-out.

Hello Residents and Friends! This was one of the best summers, lots of sun and warm temperatures with moderate rain fall. How about the Concert's in the Park, Lake Fest and the Fireworks, and let's not forget about Corn Fest! Those were fun times.

Installation of a new tornado siren at Dowell and Neville Roads is brought to you by a collaborative effort between the Village of Island Lake and Wauconda Township. This Prairie Woods, Walnut Glen and Highwood Lakes Estates, as well as unincorporated Wauconda Township.

Check your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors! Test the batteries and replace them if low/bad. (Some detectors will beep when the batteries are low.) Always replace a faulty detector immediately.

As the leaves change color, we know that Fall is around the corner. Let's start to think about fall cleaning, that entails raking, moving things around and maybe some lifting. Remember to plan and use the proper tools whenever you can, apply the buddy system if you need a hand. It's all about working safe and smart while completing the task. **Unfortunately, mosquitos stay around until the first frost.** Reminder: Get rid of any standing water where they can breed and keep plenty of mosquito repellent on hand.

The Island Lake EMA Team supports our Police Department, Public Works, Recreation, Events and the Wauconda Fire District with traffic support and community service to help keep our community safe. **Thank you to my team** for their dedication and support. **Community Safety** is our commitment to all the residents.

Do you have an Emergency Preparedness Kit on hand? You should have one that contains the following: bottled water, first-aid kit, non-perishable foods/canned foods, a good can-opener, flashlight, blankets, spare batteries, matches/lighter and a tool-kit.

Emergency Management Meetings are the 4th Wednesday of the month at the Village Hall at 7:00pm. Volunteers are welcome. Next meetings are 9/26/18 and 10/24/18. Note: We do not meet in November and December.

The aeration systems in Forest and Circle Bays are up and running! A big THANK YOU to our Public Works Department for helping to insure that the installation went smoothly. When you are driving by or out on the lake, you may notice several bubblers, water volcanoes that continuously push water to the surface. In addition, water movement units under the surface push water in and out of the bays.

This aeration system helps oxygen levels climb, creating a healthier waterway and naturally nurturing billions of bio-organisms that naturally occur in lakes and streams. These bio-organisms help break down bottom sediments over time.



The Village Board with direction of the Lake Management Committee wants to reduce pollutants. Following on the coattails of 12 plus other communities within Lake County, we have adopted an ordinance which bans all phosphate fertilizers. The Village Board with direction of the Lake Management Committee wants to reduce pollutants. Phosphate-free fertilizers can be found at most retailers. When you do your part by using phosphate-free fertilizer, you help protect our waterways for future generations.

Our watershed—which extends for miles around the Village—will receive water and runoff from



fall rains. The runoff—which can be filled with phosphates—flows into our namesake lake, Cotton Creek Marsh and also the Fox River. Approximately 14% of approximately 29 square miles of the Island Lake watershed can be characterized as disturbed areas where storm water crosses impervious surfaces and picks up phosphorous and other pollutants. Sediments wash into streams and out into the Lake bringing phosphorus attached to the soil particles. Use of phosphorus-free fertilizers helps reduce the sources of pollution flowing into the Lake.

How do you know if fertilizer is phosphate-free? On each bag of fertilizer, there will be 3 numbers. That middle number is the phosphates. When you purchase a bag of fertilizer with the middle number being "0" you are getting phosphate free fertilizer. Phosphate free fertilizers can be found at most retailers.

Will phosphorus-free fertilizer keep your lawn green and healthy? Yes! Soils in most parts of Island Lake already have enough phosphorus to grow a healthy lawn. In these instances, adding more phosphorus with fertilizer is not needed and will not benefit your lawn.

What else can you do to protect water quality besides using a phosphorus-free fertilizer on your lawn?

- Apply fertilizer at the recommended rate.
- Apply fertilizer in the fall for the best results. Don't fertilize before a storm or on frozen ground.
- Keep soil, leaves, and lawn clippings out of the street, ditches, storm drains, and stream by bagging them, composting them, or leaving them right on the lawn as a natural fertilizer.
- Mow higher. A grass length of $2\frac{1}{2} 3$ inches is healthier for your lawn and means you can mow less often!
- Pick up pet waste. Pet waste can contain harmful bacteria as well as phosphorus. Recycle it with your Yard waste or place it in the garbage.
- Control soil erosion around your house by covering exposed soil with vegetation or mulch.



Friendly reminder: Change the batteries on your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors when you turn back the clocks for "Daylight Savings" on November 4th, 2018. Note: The standard life on most detectors is 7-10 years. Find many affordable options at your local hardware or superstore.

Do you have a home fire escape plan that prepares your family to think fast and get out quickly when the smoke alarm sounds? What if your escape route is blocked by smoke or flames? Having two ways out focuses on the importance of fire escape planning and practice. Once outside, the family should all have a meeting place, such as a mailbox away from the house, or across the street. Your family should know how important it is to *get out, STAY OUT*!
