

Chief of Police - Dan Palmer



Hello, I am Dan Palmer. I was appointed to the position of Interim Chief of Police on September 27th and it is my sincere pleasure to assist the police department in providing service to the residents of Island Lake. I am here to provide stability to the Island Lake Police Department and bring about change in the organization.

All of my 31 years in law enforcement were served in the Village of Bartlett—the last 17 years as Chief of Police. I hold a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice Management and a Master of Business Administration. I am also a graduate of Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command, as well as the FBI's Law Enforcement Executive Development program.

Since my appointment, I've moved to upgrade supervision and to hire additional help. Robert Blitek was promoted to Sergeant and was sworn in on October 25th. I've asked the Village Board for an additional sergeant position in order to cover all three work shifts. The police entry level examination was given on November 10th to twice as many applicants as the 2017 test. Oral interviews will take place in December. It is my goal to fully staff the department early in 2019.



A new software system was installed by our dispatch vendor and allows two of our most common requests—overnight parking and vacation watch—to be made online. Formerly, residents had to call in or fill out a form in person. Go to villageofislandlake.com, find the overnight parking or vacation watch links on the left tool bar and make your request from the comfort of your home or from your phone.



Our police officers are dedicated to providing great service and protection. One of our officers, Officer Jason DeMark, received a Life Saving Award and Officer of the Year honors, was featured in a *Daily Herald* and was recognized by the Village Board recognized at the November meeting.

In closing, let me remind everyone that during these winter months, the sun drops rather quickly. Home security should be foremost in your mind. Check your locks and make sure you leave your lights on to discourage thieves. On the roads, remember to allow an appropriate distance to allow for stopping in rain or on snow covered roads. Wishing everyone the very best in the coming holiday time of year.

Please join the Island Lake Police Department in the Community Watch effort. The purpose of Community Watch is to engage and collaborate with our community—residents, community groups and businesses—to unite, inform, and protect our community. Meetings cover a variety of topics related to public awareness and safety and often feature guest presenters.

Hot Water Issues

Do you ever experience discoloration, odor or low flow when taking a shower or using hot water at any of your faucets? Do you ever hear crackling in your hot water tank when it tries to heat? This usually signals that your water heater needs to be flushed. Over time your hot water tank collects and builds sediment from naturally occurring minerals and they usually rest at the bottom of the tank. Not only does this cause water quality issues, but also forms an insulator at the bottom of the tank forcing the heater to work harder and require more time and energy to heat your water! **Most manufacturers recommend flushing your tank annually.** Flush your hot water tank today!



Winter is Coming!

Cold weather is here! This is our yearly reminder to residents whose plumbing is susceptible to freezing: **now is the time to insulate, heat, seal!** Residents should also know it is their responsibility to keep the water meter inside their home from freezing. A water meter that freezes can become very expensive—not only will the meter have to be replaced at cost, but any broken/leaking meters that occur outside normal working hours will be considered non-emergency and service charges will apply.

On another note, please **DO NOT bury fire hydrants with snow.** The hydrants are there for a reason; please make sure our firefighters can find them in the event of an emergency and Thank you for the residents who clear the snow surrounding the hydrants.

This fall we repaved and repaired approximately 5 miles of roads throughout the Village. These included portions of Dowell, Neville, Ridge, Honeysuckle, Greenleaf, Woodland Circle (North and South), Hyacinth, Circle North, Hillside, Victoria, River Oaks cul-de-sac, Longacre cul-de-sac, Lillian, Highland, Willow, Burnett, Ivy and Fairfield. We also added a new driveway for police vehicles. Thank you for patience as the projects were in progress.

Snow removal season preparations are in progress. Please keep the following in mind so that our crews can plow safely and efficiently.

- ⇒ Arterial streets are priority, for example: Eastway, Burnett, Waterford Way, Hale Ln., Newport Dr., Carriage Hill, Westridge Dr.
- ⇒ Mailboxes will be repaired by Public Works *only if we hit them with the snowplow*. The post and the box should be strong enough to withstand the weight of snow from the plow. (We are sending letters to owners of mailboxes we have identified as needing repair or replacement.)
- ⇒ The piling of snow on the roadway is against Village ordinance.
- ⇒ Parking on the roadway during snow removal is prohibited.
- ⇒ The plows are out there to make your travel safe; please show the crew courtesy.

DOs and DON'Ts of Snow Removal

- Do not shovel, blow or plow snow onto the roadway. Village ordinance prohibits placing snow onto the cleared roadway.
- Park your vehicle off the street when it starts to snow. This allows crews to clear the entire roadway and prevents the car from being plowed in, ticketed or towed.
- Try to clear snow around fire hydrants. This simple step could save precious time in emergencies.
- Remove portable basketball hoops, benches and decor from the street right-of-way. The Village is not responsible for damage to these items resulting from snow removal operations.
- Check that your mailbox and post are in good repair, behind the curb and not leaning out over the street.



Building Department – Wayne Schnell, Commissioner

It's time to get ready for another Northern Illinois winter. Here are some safety reminders:



- Ladders are dangerous and can change your life in a second if a fall occurs. Be careful when hanging lights and other decorations for the holidays.
- Use extension cords and/or power strips sparingly and never on a heating device. They should be safe and properly rated for their load.
- Check all smoke and carbon monoxide detectors for proper operation.
- Disconnect all hoses from outside spigots and store them away. Even though a spigot may be labeled *freeze proof*, it can still freeze and burst if a hose is connected to it.
- Clear snow and ice from ALL vehicle windows before driving. NO texting while driving.
- Keep outside steps and walkways clear. Falls are a major cause of injury.
- Do not deposit snow on roadways.
- Seal air leaks around doors and windows.
- Do not leave pets outside too long.
- Clean your furnace and dryer vents.

Anyone have an idea of why clothes dryers catch on fire? The major cause is lint traps and vent ductwork not being kept clean. I remind every landlord to clean the ducts and around the dryer at the time of inspection. The same goes for furnace filters. No matter what the device or equipment, including your car..... it will not operate efficiently unless the filters are kept clean

Emergency Management – Calvin Clay, Coordinator

Our mission is community safety within the guidelines while obtaining the proper training to support our village in the event of a disaster/emergency call-out.

Hello, residents and friends! The temperature has dropped, the days are shorter and the sun sets nearly after lunch. Here comes winter. **It's time to think about a winter safety.**

Remember to check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors: install new batteries and replace faulty units.

Snow Shoveling: Make sure you have a sturdy shovel with a long handle to minimize the stress on your shoulders and lower back. Snow-Blowers work best, doing the heavy work with efficiency and speed. *Read all safety instructions and manuals before you operate the equipment.*

Clear the sidewalk for our kids and residents walking to and from the bus stop on the street. (Please don't throw the snow into the street.)

The Island Lake EMA Team supports our Police Department, Fire District, Public Works and Parks and Recreation Department with traffic support and community service that helps our community stay safe. I would like to thank my team for their dedication and support. **Community Safety** is our commitment to all the residents.

Plan appropriately and take proper steps for winter-safety. Prepare a winter safety kit for your home and your vehicle in case of a snow storm with large accumulation or a power outage/ice storm.

The Home Winter Emergency Preparedness Kit should contain the following: bottled water, first-aid kit, non-perishable foods, a good flashlight, blankets\comforters, spare batteries, matches/lighter and a toolkit with can-opener. **The Winter Emergency Car-Kit** should contain: jumper cables, shovel, gloves, blanket, and LED-type flare/standard flare/flash light.

Lake Management Committee – Ken Wick (LMC)

As another summer comes to an end and ice starts to form, please be cautious when you are on the lake. Keep away from open water and slushy areas. Remember, *dark ice is often NOT safe!*

Natural oxygen is critical to the health of the lake and its inhabitants—especially in the winter months. To create oxygen through the process of photosynthesis, sunlight must penetrate the ice. Clearing just a small area can contribute to a healthy oxygen levels. The smaller bays are most affected in the winter. The Lake Management Committee encourages you to shovel an ice-skating rink or small area on the lake to help promote lake health.

Be courteous, please. Do not drill any ice-fishing holes or drive snowmobiles or ATV's within shoveled areas or ice skating rinks—especially around our public parks. These areas are maintained for the enjoyment of ice skating and hockey.

OBSERVE SPEED LIMITS for snowmobiles and ATVs.

Maximum speed before 10 am and after sunset: 5 (five) mph

Maximum speed after 10 am and before sunset only: 20 (twenty) mph



To provide a sustaining fishery for future generations, **fish harvesting regulations will be strictly enforced**—especially during the ice-fishing season. Regulations are posted below and available in the Lake handbook or at the Village Hall.

Garbage and Recycling Pickup FAQs

Q: Why didn't my couch, mattress or other large item get picked up?

A: Large items must be of a weight that one person can lift without dragging. If you have larger or heavier items, call Prairieland, 847-381-9300 no later than the Friday before Monday pickup to arrange pickup for a fee.



Q: What do I do when my garbage doesn't get picked up?

A: Call Prairieland Customer Service, 847-381-9300, within 24 hours of the missed pickup.

Q: When is the Christmas tree pickup?

A: The first two Mondays of 2019: January 7 and 14; trees must be bare and not in plastic bags.

Q: Where can you bring household batteries for recycling? *The Village of Island Lake cannot accept household batteries for recycling.* A number of businesses accept them for a fee (they have to pay to get rid of them). For example:

The holiday season is a time when we think about the many reasons to be grateful. We also need to think about ways to be careful!



A friendly reminder: Smoke and CO detector batteries should be changed when you change your clocks for daylight savings. If you haven't done that already, do it now. If your alarm is going off without reason, read the instructions on the back. Typically, smoke and CO detectors should be replaced after 5-7 years. Local hardware and home improvement stores carry them.

If you decorate for the holidays, do so safely. Real trees need *A LOT* of water. *NEVER* have an open flame near, on or around a real tree. Do not overload electrical extension cords or run them under carpet. Make sure your lighting has a label from an independent testing laboratory. Remember to turn off all of your decorations before you leave your home or go to sleep at night.

For safe use of wood stoves and fire places: Make sure you have had them cleaned. Chimney fires are extremely common at the start of this time of year. Have your chimney cleaned by a professional; it will not only give you piece of mind, but could potentially save your family and home. Last—but certainly not least—make an escape plan with your entire family and practice it.


