I hope everyone enjoyed the events of the Village offered to our community. It was good to see you at the Concerts in the Park. I hope you enjoyed the carnival and fireworks in June. The carnival raised about \$8,000 that will help fund the fireworks and other events.

Welcome to Dan Powell, our newest trustee, who was appointed at the July 25 board meeting. We are back at full strength on the board. Welcome also to Russell Kraly, our new Building Official. I am grateful that our community steps up to serve.



Residents often ask me, "Why are

our taxes so high?" Part of my response is that taxes are high all over Illinois - not just in Island Lake. Just a quick reminder about where your real estate taxes go, using the Lake County tax distribution example. The Village of Island Lake gets only 7.1% of your bill. The rest is divided between the other 9 taxing districts - with the school district getting the biggest share at 67.9%.

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) project at Rte. 176 and Roberts Rd. is for a right turn lane for eastbound traffic turning onto Roberts. Due to unforeseen soil conditions and the need to move ComEd utility poles, the project got a late start. The project, when completed, will improve traffic flow.

The annexation of the property at Rte. 176 and River Rd. was approved at the August 8 board meeting. This is the site of the proposed Circle K, a gas station facility similar to the Thornton's station at Rte. 176 and Darrell Rd. The board addressed many concerns before approving the agreement and zoning. IDOT and the McHenry County Division of Transportation (MCDOT) are addressing one of the biggest concerns: entrance from Rte. 176 and River Rd.

Public Safety and Community Alerts Program Soon to be Available



The Village of Island Lake will soon make available to residents a program enabling them to receive various alerts regarding public safety and other community-related messages. In early September, those who have landlines will receive a message about the new program.

For mobile phones you will be able to opt in by texting 888-777 and entering 60042 in the message. You will then receive a text from Nixle Public Safety with instructions and the option for adding an email address.

Once the program goes live, there will be a link on the Village website (villageofislandlake.com) for opting in.

Chief of Police - Dan Palmer



By the time you are reading this newsletter, school will be well underway. **Please drive carefully.** September brings with it earlier sunsets. As a result, children participating in after school activities and sports may arrive home during the usual rush hour and after dark.

As you may have heard, the State Law on cell phone use was tightened effective July 1, 2019. Simply holding a cell phone in your hand while operating a motor vehicle is a moving violation. Island Lake Police routinely enforce this law. With improving manpower, expect to see a renewed effort in enforcement of this



important area.

One of my primary duties when I arrived here was to stabilize the department. The end of September will mark my first full year here in Island Lake and that stabilization has been achieved. In the nearly three years prior to my arrival, this department lost a total of 17 employees. Hiring is an expensive proposition, costing much more than an individual salary. Associated costs include wasted training expenses, uniform costs—as well as costing the department experienced personnel. Since my arrival, no other employees that I was hired to lead have left the department. Training, morale and attitudes have improved sharply. Your Mayor and Board of Trustees recognized and acted on this need and should be congratulated for solving this issue.



Sometime in October or November, you will be noticing the new squads out in patrol. Another area that required attention was the police fleet. Too many cars had too many miles and were being used beyond what they should have been. Recently, the Board approved a lease agreement with Enterprise Leasing to begin to update our fleet. It's a step toward replacing the fleet, making the squad cars uniform and allowing the officers better equipment with which to serve the community.

I hope everyone is able to get out and enjoy a wonderful Fall. By my score, Mother Nature owes us a beautiful and long Fall Season.

Please join the Island Lake Police Department in the Community Watch effort. The purpose of Community Watch is to engage and collaborate with our community—residents, community groups and businesses—to unite, inform, and protect our community. Meetings cover a variety of topics related to public awareness and safety and often feature guest presenters.

Water Department - Patrick Stewart, Water Superintendent



Ethel Terrace and Oak Terrace water main projects were completed October 1st 2018, and to date 100% of customers affected have switched over to the new main. We would like to thank everyone for their cooperation and understanding. *Thank You!*

Twice a month, our staff collects samples from residents' homes for the purpose of bacteriological analysis. The samples are collected from sites throughout town that are approved by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. Thank you to all of our residents that have volunteered. **Thanks so much again!**

Insulate your water lines.

Fall is here and the time is now! Check your crawl space/basement for any small holes or gaps that will allow cold air to blow on your water lines, causing them to freeze and possibly burst. It is much easier to do this now than in January in subzero temperatures.

Water and Garbage Rate Increase

The quarterly garbage bill increased from \$52.00 to \$54.00 per quarter* (per Ordinance 1593-19, available on our website here: https://villageofislandlake.com/wp-content/uploads/2019/08/1593-19-Garbage-Fees.pdf and as listed in the message center of your last garbage bill.).



This represents an increase of \$8.00 per home per year to cover the cost of the annual increase in rates of the current contract from our waste hauler.

Your next water bill will reflect an increase in the rate per \$1,000 gallons from \$4.18 to \$5.00 (per Ordinance 1594-19, available on our website here: https://villageofislandlake.com/wp-content/uploads/2019/08/1594-19-Water-Rates.pdf). The service charge remains at \$34.00* per quarter. The increase will help to fund maintenance and improvements to the water system infrastructure. Even with the increase, the Village of Island Lake rates are in the middle of the rates in our neighboring communities/municipalities.

*Seniors (65 years and better) are eligible for a 20% discount on the quarterly service fee portion of the water bill, and on the quarterly garbage bill. Register in person at the Village Hall to receive the discount.

enjoyed in your career here. We appreciate the way you mentored and guided the team.



FREE MULCH for Island Lake residents! Enhance your yard and garden with *free mulch* available at Converse Park North (across the street from the Converse Park parking lot and playground). Bring your shovel and containers, as you will have to load it yourself. Load at your own risk. The Village of Island Lake is not responsible for damage to vehicles and equipment or injuries incurred.

Keep leaves and grass clippings out of the street and away from storm sewers, please. They can be dangerous to traffic—especially to bike and motorcycles. They can clog up storm sewers and cause flooding or poor drainage. Thank you for supporting the safety of our streets and the people who use them.

It's a good time of the year to make sure your mailbox posts are sturdy and secure. The Village will repair mailboxes *only if we hit them.* Your mailbox post should be secure enough to withstand the weight and impact of snow pushed by the plow. The U.S. Postal Service suggests a 4" x 4" wooden support or a 2" diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe. Building Department - Russell Kraly, Building Official



I am pleased to serve the Village of Island Lake as your new Building Official. Let me briefly introduce myself. I have over forty years in public service of one form or another. My various roles include: building inspector and building and zoning official, village administrator, president of Zoning Board of Appeals, Police Pension Board trustee and Round Lake village trustee (in my third term). I am a licensed and certified building inspector. I look forward to meeting you in the course of my work.

Does your project require a permit? As you plan to finish your outdoor projects this fall and get ready for indoor projects this winter, make sure you have all your paperwork ready when you submit your application. Please note:

- Homeowners Association (HOA) approval letter—where applicable—must be submitted with your permit application.
- Contractors must be registered with the Village of Island Lake. If you are using a contractor, make sure he or she has a current registration.
- **Plat of survey**—where applicable—must be submitted with your permit application. <u>The Village of Island Lake does keep records of plats of survey.</u> (You may have a copy with your mortgage papers.)

Typical projects that require permits include:

- Additions and basement build-outs.
- Paver patios and walkways.
- · Decks and porches.
- Concrete slabs, patios and sidewalks.
- Demolitions of any structure.
- Dumpster in residential area.
- Driveways and parking lots.
- Electrical new or upgrades (Copper wire and metal conduit is required.)
- Plumbing new or upgrades
- Seawalls, docks and piers.
- Fireplaces and fire pits.

- HVAC new or upgrades. Furnaces, A/C units and water heaters.
- · Fences, garages and sheds.
- Gazebos, screen rooms and pergolas.
- Kitchen or bath remodeling that involves structural and/or utility changes.
- Roofing, gutters and downspouts.
- Siding, fascia and soffit.
- Windows and doors.
- Signs and flagpoles.
- Swimming pools and hot tubs

An Owner Transfer Inspection (OTI) is required before the sale of a property. See the checklist on our website at the link below. Rental Inspections and Registrations are also required at all rental units.

Reminder: Check your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors. Test the and replace them if they are weak. *Replace a faulty detector immediately.*

Lake Management Committee – Ken Wick (LMC)

Lake Management Committee (LMC) has long term goals. We have been looking into what it would take to dredge our lake. This is a MUST for the future and health of Island Lake. The lake is nearly 100 years old and with that nearly 100 years of sludge and buildup on the lake bottom (With the exception of circle bay and forest bay that had some sludge removed in the 80's). The proper way to reclaim our lake would be to dredge.

Currently, the LMC is looking at quotes for Hydrographic surveys and sediment studies. With this being the first step, we will know approximately just how much sediment has built up over its life and the possibility to restore the lake bottom and depths back to their original specs. These surveys use specific sonar equipment to determine the actual depth of sediments and beyond. We will be able to know if the "true" lake bottom consists of sand, stone and gravel. This will also determine the amount of material that would need to be removed, and will be vital information for future planning. Once this first step of the process is completed, the Lake Management Committee will then present this information to the Board of Trustees with a recommendation. This will be a LONG term research and/ or project we hope one day will become reality for our Villages Largest Park and future generations to come.

Reminder: Help preserve our water quality by using phosphorus-free fertilizers ONLY.

September and October can deliver lots of rain and water into our watershed. This runoff flows into our namesake lake, Cotton Creek Marsh and also the Fox River. The Village adopted an ordinance banning the use of all phosphate fertilizers. Phosphate free fertilizers can be found at most retailers. On each bag of fertilizer, the middle of the three numbers represents phosphates. When you purchase a bag of fertilizer with the middle number of "0" you are getting phosphate free fertilizer.



Do your part to protect water quality when you...

Apply fertilizer at the recommended rate. (Fall is the best time to apply for good results.)

Don't fertilize before a storm or apply fertilizer to frozen ground.

Keep soil, leaves, and lawn clippings out of the street, ditches, storm drains, and stream; bag, compost, or leaving them on the lawn aa natural fertilizer.

Mow higher. Keeping your grass length to $2\frac{1}{2} - 3$ inches is healthier for your lawn and means you can mow less often!

Pick up pet waste. It can contain harmful bacteria as well as phosphorus.

Control soil erosion around your house by covering exposed soil with vegetation or mulch. Bare soil is easily washed away and into storm sewers when it rains.

There have been many trees in the water, IT IS the homeowners responsibility to have any trees removed that have fallen from your property into the waterway. If the tree has been or is rooted from your property and falls into the lake, it is the homeowners responsibility to have it removed within 30 days. Most often this will be covered under your homeowners insurance.



Did you know?

- The Village of Island Lake does not provide wild animal control unless an animal is an immediate threat. If you have an animal pest on your property, call a private agency for removal.
- The Village of Island Lake does not have legal plats of survey on file. Check your mortgage papers for a copy. You
 may need to get a survey done if you don't have one and if it is required for a permit application.
- The Senior Discount on your <u>water</u> bill applies only to the service fee portion—(not the per 1,000 gallons charge.)
 However, the discount does apply to the entire garbage bill.
- The Village of Island Lake bills for water and garbage only. Northern Moraine Water Reclamation District (NMWRD) sanitary (sewer) bills must be paid to NMWRD by mail or in person at 420 Timber Trail, Island Lake.



The Story behind our Cobra Helicopter by Bob Carpenter, Project Manager

Through the efforts of many volunteers working with the VFW Post 2486 and the American Legion Post 911, our Cobra Helicopter Tail Number 15-736 was brought to Island Lake in 2002, where it was dedicated and released for public display. It served in Vietnam from 1969 to 1972, then went to Hawaii to be used for training. Our Cobra logged 1,807 flight hours before being released from active duty in 1975.

Newly refurbished Cobra Helicopter Tail Number 15-736 was rededicated on July 4, 2019,



following the Village Picnic. Captain Barry DuFor, former Cobra pilot and flight instructor, led the ceremony and provided a history of the helicopter's service in Vietnam. Mayor Amrich, also a Vietnam veteran, also spoke. Captain Barry gave special recognition to Chet Malanowski, who did the repainting. Many others helped with the cleaning, scrapping, prepping and application of new stencils and decals.

FALL, 1941

The publishing of an Island Lake newsletter for residents began decades ago. Even though the Village was not yet incorporated and was made up of mostly summer homes, the Property Owners Association published the newsletter and sent it to those who paid their property owner dues. The Fall, 1941 issue included news from the Association—such as expected dues of \$3,226 to cover the road maintenance and deputy salary.

Who were "Bring-'Em-In-Riley" and Ed Dumaski? The newsletter highlighted residents who contributed to the community. William Riley was called "Bring-Em-In-Riley" because he was responsible for about one sixth of the Property Owners Association membership. Ed Dumaski had been hired by the association because he was reliable and had a truck. He would haul garbage and sand and gravel. He would also do "gate watch" services.

Pictures and stories of resident's social life and ads for local businesses filled the newsletter. Does anyone remember Carr's Sweet Shop in Wauconda, Heul's Lunch & Cabins, Clem's Picture Bar, or Peterson's Dry Goods Store?

The Historical Society of Island Lake is fortunate to have original copies of many of the newsletters that were from a simpler time and filled with stories of those who were passionate about their little lakeside community.
