



VILLAGE OF ISLAND LAKE

The Village of Island Lake is following the guidelines of the President, the Governor and public health officials to help limit the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

The Village Hall (located at 3720 Greenleaf Avenue) remains closed until further notice. All in-person, over-the-counter services are suspended. Utility bill payments, building/zoning permits, and all licensing and registration services must be done by mail, the drop box or online.

Utility Billing: Water and Garbage payments

Residents can make utility bill payments during this time in any of the following ways:

1. **By Mail:** Check or money order payments can be sent to the mailing address listed on the bill: 3720 Greenleaf Avenue, Island Lake, IL 60042
2. **Drop Box:** Check or money order payments can be left in the drop box at the front door of the building. Include your account number on your check. Cash payments can be made only M-F from 8 am – 4:30pm (no change will be given). **NO CASH PAYMENTS after 4:30pm or on weekends.**

Building Permits

Return your completed application with all required information: (*where applicable*: 1) plat of survey, 2) homeowners association approval letter, 3) contractor registration, 4) proposal/contract
