- 2. Roll Call Present: Trustees Chris Carlsen, Chuck Cermak, Harold England, Richard McLaughlin, Dan Powell and Will Ziegler. Absent: none. Also present: Mayor Charles R. Amrich, Clerk Georgine Cooper, Attorney David McArdle (remotely), Treasurer Ed McGinty, Police Chief Dan Palmer, Building Commissioner Russell Kraly, Technology and Innovation Director George Muligano, Planning and Zoning Chair Joe Zeinz (remotely)

6. Public Comment included: Robert Carpenter requested permission to chair the May 31, 2021 Memorial Day Commemoration Ceremony at Veterans Park, 2:45. Trustees commended his work over the years and asked what they could do to help. Asked to place 50 to 150 flags at noon the Saturday, May 29, 2021 before.

Discussion: Trustee Ziegler: Pat Skinner reached out to us with these open dates. Ideally we like to marry this with the fireworks, but this came after; can think it through for next year. Trustee Carlsen: Likes that there are two events; would like to see the carnival with music.

Ayes: Trustees Carlsen, Cermak, Powell, Pyne, and Ziegler. Nays: none. Motion carried.

15. Discussion on future of Lake Management Committee

Trustee Ziegler: As you know, Chair of Lake Committee resigned; we have 3 people left as we had openings before. Do we want to fill in the members, or combine it with Parks Advisory Committee? Mayor McLaughlin: 8 is a lot of people. For Board Committee members would like to reduce from 5 to 3 members. Parks Advisory has 2 trustees and 4 committee members. Attorney McArdle: It can be stressful to have 2 board members have to be on the same committee. Trustee Pyne: Why was Lake Committee separated out? Trustee Ziegler: If we combine the committees, we can address needs in the budget. Trustee Cermak: How will this work with meeting time? How will the division of roles work? Trustee Carlsen: We'll be getting reports for new lake treatment company. Trustee Ziegler: This is their job. Trustee Cermak: They take care of lake, not beaches and shorelines. Mayor McLaughlin: People are reaching out to see if there are opportunities to contribute. Powell: 3 from Parks, 3 from Lakes plus the trustee. Trustee Cermak: Look at ordinances for who has responsibilities for ponds/lakes. Attorney McArdle will rewrite ordinance. Trustee Ziegler will speak with committee members about meeting time and committee combination. Trustee Carlsen: IDNR takes care of Island Lake. Trustee Cermak: Slocum Lake is not in Island Lake or part of Waters Edge. HOAs take care of their retention ponds

16. Mayor Comments included: Spoke with representative of a 5-acre parcel on Roberts Road; they want us to annex the property and want to have a truck driving school on it. Mayor McLaughlin polled the Board; Consensus: Not an appropriate use; looking for businesses that will bring income. Has been working with Amanda Nye to get a film crew out here at Island Foods the first week of June for Amazon's *Light Year's* series. In the absence of permit fees, they will make a donation for Village parks. Thanked voters and promised to do good work for the Village; want to keep positive direction.

17. Trustee and Staff Comments included:

Trustee Carlsen: Welcomed Trustee Pyne and congratulations to returning trustees; appreciated Mayor Amrich's legacy; would like to do something for him. Congratulated Mayor McLaughlin. Trustee Cermak: Welcomed new and returning officials. Looks forward to the next 4 years. Trustee Powell: Welcomed Trustee Pyne and returning trustees.

Trustee Pyne: Thanked everyone for helping her to get here; looks forward to working with everyone. Trustee Ziegler: Congratulated officials and looks forward to working with board; appreciates dedicated officials. Director Muligano: Wished everyone luck and good wishes. Clerk Cooper: Recommended local restaurants to film crew; introduced SOLVE model. Chair Zeinz: Planning and Zoning looking forward to working with new officials. Committee Member Fosco: Anxious to be here and get to work.

Building Official Kraly submitted correspondence with Pulte Group, new builders for Walnut Glen and Prairie Woods. They would like to build 2 models; asked if they had to do fire suppression system in the models. Official Kraly met them with costs including impact fees and they were amendable. Trustee Carlsen: They are not required; they are optional. Official Kraly: They expect to sign the final papers at the end of May and would like to break ground on the models in June. Trustee Ziegler: Are we only going to require them to adhere to Village ordinances—for example side yard setbacks? Requirements are 10 feet; Walnut Glen has 13 feet; would like to see setbacks consistent with Walnut Glen. Response: Pulte said they were complying with what was approved for those lots.

Planning and Zoning Chair Zeinz quoted the ordinance provisions of 10 feet or 10% of width whatever is greater. Trustee Powell: For 130 foot lot, that is 13 feet. Trustee Ziegler wants the 13 foot setbacks to 5/13/2021 Agenda Page 3 of 4

conform to other homes. Trustee Carlsen: At what point will be over the capacity to deliver water to the neighborhood? Official Kraly: M with Water Superintendent Stewart over this proposal. Official Kraly: Will get plat of survey before permitting and will see how the house lays out.

18. Public Comment included: Bob Carpenter: Hoped this is the start of short board meetings.
