So many great things are happening since I began my term as your Mayor in April. I am proud of volunteers and community groups that have stepped up and pitched in.

One of my biggest challenges is to find additional revenue for the Village. We are working to attract new businesses, looking for grants, and pursuing partnerships to help with funding important projects.

The baseball fields at the Village

Hall are getting a makeover. The dugouts now have new roofs, fresh paint, and replacement of wood where needed. Other improvements are planned.

New water mains will be installed on Cedar Terrace, Pine Terrace, and Spruce Terrace. in the original section of town. This project is funded completely by grant money received for water infrastructure. **Fall repaving projects** include parts of Burnett Road and Eastway Drive. Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) funds received from the State of Illinois will pay for this road work.

Big SHOUT-OUT to our Public Works Department. They kept our roads clean and operational during the summer storms and took away the brush and tree limbs that residents brought to the roadside.

Murray and Public Works Director Chris Carlsen. Welcome also
to Building Official Ken Adkins, Code Enforcer Dan Celske and
Events Coordinator Christina Ryback.

Many programs and events have returned! Some Recreation Programs and Creative Playtime Preschool are now in session with safety measures in place. Summer concerts, LakeFest and Oktoberfest were back. Watch our website for updates for other programs and events that can be safely added.

Chief of Police - Dan Palmer



Fall has arrived; *drivers be vigilant*. Adjust your driving habits and attention accordingly. School is in session. The nights become crisp and fall activities begin in earnest. With it, the sun starts dropping earlier each day. Though it will be getting darker earlier, the kids will still be out and about.

As I near three years with the department, I can tell you that the staffing is full, expenses are under control and the equipment is where it needs to be. Despite some anti-police feelings nationwide, I hear regularly of great service being provided by the Island Lake police officers. While I don't always get to

speak with each individually, rest assured the comments have made their way back to me.

Police Vehicle Fleet Upgrades: The entire fleet of police vehicles has been replaced and upgraded. The old sedans—many with nearly 150,000 miles on them—have been replaced by new Ford Police Interceptors which are built on the Explorer frame. These new vehicles are safer and result in fewer maintenance costs than in the past. The Village Board has adopted a vehicle replacement plan that allows us to rotate vehicles on a more regular basis, trading them when their value remains higher, but before maintenance/depreciation devalue them completely.

Keeping Current with New Laws and Policies: There was a sea change in laws governing police departments in Illinois last winter. Many of these new laws took effect this year; more will roll out over the next few years. Another important department upgrade was the purchase of the Lexipol policy service. Island Lake is too small to afford a full time policy expert. Lexipol creates templates and customizes them for the needs of our department. Six police department employees are assisting in this process. Aside from the new policies, the service will immediately change or update policies in real time as laws or court decisions command.

Regional Cooperation: The department has joined many regional groups that provide extended services should the department ever need them. They include major traffic accident investigations, major crime investigations and gang enforcement. The setup is that we assign an officer to the unit and that officer participates in any calls from any member agencies. In return, those services are offered to us as well should we ever need them—much like insurance that spreads the risk to a larger group.

2021 Water Main Replacement Project

Berger Construction has been awarded the contract for the 2021 Water System Improvements. Plans are to install approximately 1,570 feet of 8" water main on Cedar, Spruce, and Pine Terrace off Burnett Rd. We will keep the residents in the affected areas informed via mail or hand carried letters as timeframes become established.

Perfect Compliance!

For 26 years in a row, the Island Lake Water Department was recognized by the Illinois Department of Health and the Environmental Protection Agency for maintaining optimal fluoride levels. We have received a certificate of commendation for each year. My hat goes off to our water supply operators: Rick Beaudoin & Matt Billings.

Fall is here!

The time to insulate your water lines is now! Check your crawl space/basement for any small holes or gaps that will allow cold air to blow on your water lines causing them to freeze and possibly burst. It is much easier doing this now then in January in subzero temperatures.




Public Works - Chris Carlsen, Director

I am looking forward to working with a great team who continues to provide excellent service to our residents through the day to day duties needed to keep our public streets and properties in order. I would especially like to praise the way they stepped up to clear the streets and help residents clean up debris through the two recent storms.

Drive carefully in work zones. Fall projects by contractors are now—or will soon be—in progress: repaving on parts of Eastway Dr and Burnett Rd. and water main improvements on Pine, Cedar, and Spruce Terr.

Snow Removal Season Reminders





- Do not shovel, blow or plow snow onto the street.
- Park your vehicle off the street when it starts to snow.
- Please show the snow plow crew courtesy. They are out there to make your travel safe.
- Try to clear snow around fire hydrants. This simple step could save precious time in emergencies.



- Remove portable items from the road right-of-way—for example, basketball hoops, benches and decor. The Village is not responsible for damage to these items resulting from snow removal operations.
- Mailboxes will be repaired by Public Works only if we hit them with the snowplow. The post
 and the box should be strong enough to withstand the weight of snow from the plow. The
 US Postal Service provides guidelines for mailboxes here: https://www.usps.com/manage/mailboxes.htm.

Did you know?

- The Village of Island Lake does not provide wild animal control unless an animal is an immediate threat. If you have an animal pest on your property, call a private agency for removal.
- The Village of Island Lake DOES NOT have legal plats of survey on file. Check your mortgage papers for a copy. You may need to get a survey done if you don't have one and if it is required for a permit application.
- •The Senior Discount on your water bill applies only to the service fee portion—(not the per 1,000 gallons charge.)
- •The Village of Island Lake bills for water only. Northern Moraine Water Reclamation District (NMWRD) sanitary sewer bills must be paid to NMWRD by mail or in person at 420 Timber Trail, Island Lake. Prairieland Garbage bills must be paid to Prairieland/GFL at the address listed on your bill.

Building / Code Enforcement

Are you planning fall and winter building projects? Don't forget to apply for a permit. Find the forms on our website here: https://villageofislandlake.com/forms/. Fill out permit application completely and provide all paperwork. We cannot process incomplete applications.

- Include Plat of Survey/Blueprint when applicable. (*The Village does NOT have plats of survey.*)
- Include the contractor proposal and make sure your contractor is registered.
- Include HOA (Home Owner's Association) letter of approval, when applicable.

Reminder: Fall is also the time to change your smoke detector batteries.

Are you the landlord of a residential property in Island Lake? The Village of Island Lake requires the registration and inspection of all rental properties. Re-registration is required every two years. Rental inspections are required with every change of tenant. This helps protect the property owner and tenant. The Rental Registration Application and a Rental Inspection Checklist are available at the Village Hall and on our website in the Forms tab.



NOTE: The Village no longer requires Owner Transfer Inspections when you sell your property. *However*, we still need to know about a property sale at least two weeks in advance of the closing so that we can do a final read for your water bill.

Cleaning and maintaining your property: Fall is as good a season as spring for cleanup and other work on your property. It is the property owner's responsibility to remove dead trees that are in danger of falling or dropping branches. Repair damaged fence parts. Try to look at your property through your neighbor's eyes.

our Police, Public Works, Parks and Rec, and Events Departments and the Wauconda Area Fire District with traffic support and community service. This helps keep our community safe.



Three of the members will have a primary focus on parks and three will have a primary focus on the lake.

Among the projects already undertaken by the Commission are: grant research and application, creating a "parks scorecard" based on an inspection of all parks.

Discussion of organizational development of Vision, Goals, Objectives and Actions are planned for the November, 2021 meeting.




