#### Spring is in the air!

Coming soon to Island Lake: Dollar General: I am pleased to announce that ground breaking for a new Dollar General store in Island Lake is projected for April 2022.

Senior housing for Island Lake: Lincoln Avenue Capital

has applied for funding from the Illinois Housing Development Authority (IDHA) to build a 52-unit residence building for ages 55+ on the former Sheltering Oak site on Beech Street. Ground breaking is projected for January 2023.

Spring repaving projects funded by motor fuel tax money: Peter Baker & Son Paving will repave Burnett Road from River Road to Eastway Drive, and Eastway Drive from Burnett Road to Honeysuckle Avenue. We are currently evaluating streets in Fox River Shores for repaving.

Lake Michigan Water Feasibility Analysis: The Village Board approved a Robinson Engineering proposal to determine the feasibility of participating in Joint Action Water Agency (JAWA) to bring Lake Michigan water to the Village.

Lakeview Bridge Replacement Project Status: BLA Engineering, who are overseeing the Lakeview Bridge project are working on the engineering design phase. Beginning April 4 residents in the immediate vicinity of the bridge will see survey crews near their property. Stay tuned for progress updates.

Pulte Builders are working on permitting and building of new homes in the in the Walnut Glen and Prairie Ridge subdivisions. New homes and residents will help us attract new businesses to serve our residents and bring in much needed revenue.

Thanks to State Senator McConchie,
Congresswoman Lauren Underwood and State
Representative Martin McLaughlin for helping us
apply for funding for critical needs in the Village—
like water infrastructure, parks and building
improvements. We eagerly await grant amounts.

## Chief of Police - Dan Palmer Happy Spring and, very soon, Happy Summer!



With the warming temperatures and increased amount of sunlight, outdoor activities will be revving up. Expect to see school children active and moving about the Village. Drivers,

keep in mind that you have a great deal more experience as you navigate the roadways. Be aware that they may not be as cautious as they should be all the time.

Speeding auto and stop sign violations are among the most frequent complaints received by the police department. Our officers endeavor to respond accordingly, but cannot be everywhere. Also, motorists always tend to behave better with a squad in the vicinity as opposed to when they're not.

The police department continues to implement programs and policies in compliance with both new laws and best practices.

The old policy manual was outdated and improperly communicated to staff. Immediate problems were addressed after I arrived in Island Lake. But the manual was always in need of a dramatic update. Last year the Village Board approved the purchase and annual updating of our policy manual via the Lexipol system. Lexipol not only gives us a personalized (for Island Lake) policy manual, but they also offer ongoing training, regular review of policies of high importance and a one source computer based access point that all officers can refer to in real time. Updates are important as they sometimes result from a Supreme Court decision or a change in State Law. It is imperative that each officer receive and understand the changes quickly. We're looking forward to serving our residents as well as seeing many of you at our community events.

April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month. Texting while driving puts everyone on the road at risk. The Island Lake Police Department will be ticketing drivers who text or use their cell phones while driving.



### **Water Department**

Hydrant Flushing is scheduled to begin in early April. Check for hydrant flushing signs posted at

major intersections and at entrances to subdivisions, as well as a more detailed schedule on the Village website. The water distribution system is flushed periodically to improve water quality and ensure that hydrants are in proper operating condition for emergencies. When flushing occurs in your neighborhood, you may experience some minor, temporary loss of water pressure. Also, be sure to check your tap water before doing laundry, as the process may stir up naturally occurring minerals which can stain fabrics. If you notice any discoloration in your water, turn on the cold water tap until it runs clear.

Fix That Leak! Did you know that one of the more common causes of an unexpected spike in your water bill is a leaky toilet? You could be wasting about 200 gallons a day, which is the equivalent of flushing your toilet more than 50 times for no reason! Test for leaks by placing a drop of food coloring in the toilet tank. If the color shows up in the bowl without flushing, you have a leak.

SPRING REPAVING WORK: Burnett Road from River Road to Eastway and Eastway Drive from Burnett Road to Honeysuckle Avenue will be repaved this spring. Drive safely, be patient and be prepared to stop in work zones.

## EASEMENT VS. RIGHT OF WAY: WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR DAMAGED TREES AND DOWNED LIMBS?

The Village frequently receive calls—especially after storms—about damaged trees and downed tree limbs. The Village is not responsible for maintenance or removal for trees on private property. Under normal circumstances, the Village does not pick up tree limbs. However, after major storms with extensive tree damage, Public Works may remove downed limbs if you call to request and place them at the curbside/road's edge.

Easements are located on private property and are the responsibility of the homeowner. Check your plat of survey for the boundaries of your property. (Note: The Village does not have copies of plats of survey for personal properties.)

Easements are usually located along back or side property lines.

Rights of way are located on public property along roadways and are the responsibility of the Village. This includes the road, curbing, ditch, sidewalk, signs, street lights and trees. Additionally, the storm water removal system may originate in the right of way and flow through easements.

Call the Public Works Department: 847-526-8767 to report a maintenance issue in the right of way. *Note: To report trees on a power line, call ComEd: 800-EDISON (800-334-7661)*.

Conservation property may also border your property—for example, Cotton Creek Marsh is part of the McHenry County Conservation District. Contact the District at 815-338-6223 with questions or issues about trees on conservation land.

#### **KEEP STREETS AND STORM SEWERS FREE**

OF DEBRIS. Grass clippings in the roadway are a hazard—especially to motorcycle and bicycle riders. Keep grass clippings from your lawnmower and other yard waste out of the roadway and off the storm sewer covers. In addition to posing a danger to traffic, clippings can also block storm sewers in heavy rains and cause flooding problems in neighboring yards.

### **Emergency Management**

Rain and storm season Monitor local weather via weather-channel/radio/weather app/weather-radio and any other type device that monitors severe weather within our local area. Severe storms that can approach quickly and without warning.

Tornado warning sirens When the forecast predicts severe weather, be ready. The National Weather Service (NWS) issues a *tornado watch* when weather conditions make a tornado *possible*. If a funnel cloud is detected, the NWS issues a *tornado warning* and the sirens will sound the alarm. *Note: The Village tornado sirens are tested the first Tuesday of the month at 10:00 a.m.* For more information, go to www.weather.gov/safety/tornado.

- Take immediate shelter in a safe place away from windows, the basement preferably. If no basement is available, seek shelter in a closet, on the lower level and away from doors. Monitor conditions until the threat has expired.
- Keep an emergency bag ready with bottled

water, flashlight, safety/tool kit, and food supplies.
 Have a safe meeting place established where family members can meet if displaced; list phone numbers to check on family, friends and neighbors to make sure they are safe.

Reminder: Check your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors. Test the batteries and replace them if they are weak. Replace a faulty detector immediately.

#### **Building / Code Enforcement**

#### **BUILDING PERMIT REQUIREMENTS Are**

building projects on your "to do" list? Find building permit information and application forms on our website here <a href="https://villageofislandlake.com/forms/">https://villageofislandlake.com/forms/</a>. For a quick guide to requirements, click on Building Dept. Information; for an application, click on Building Permit Application. You must include all necessary paperwork with your application.

- Include Plat of Survey/Blueprint when applicable. (The Village does not have plats of survey.)
- Include the contractor proposal and make sure your contractor is registered.
- Include HOA (Home Owner's Association) letter of approval when applicable.

Note: Permit processing may take 7 – 10 business days—especially in the busy summer season.

Swimming Pools and Fences are popular summer projects that require permits. See Title 8, Chapter 6 (Swimming Pools) and Chapter 2 (Fences) of the *Village Code* on our website.

RENTAL PROPERTY REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS The Village of Island Lake requires the registration and inspection of rental properties every 2 years and with every change of tenant. Rental Registration Application and Inspection Checklist are available at the Village Hall and on our website in the Forms tab.

#### PROPERTY TRANSFER/SALE OF

PROPERTY The Village does not require Owner Transfer Inspections when you sell your property. However, you still need to notify the Village at least two weeks in advance of a property closing to request a reading for final water bill.

#### **CLEAN AND MAINTAINING YOUR**

PROPERTY Spring is an opportune time to do cleanup and maintenance work on your property. Remove diseased and dying trees (it is the property owner's responsibility, per Title 4, Chapter 2 of the *Village Code*). Repair damaged fence parts. Keep lawn and garden in an orderly condition (see Title 5, Chapter 3). Try to look at your property through your neighbor's eyes.

#### "DO NOT FEED THE GEESE" CAMPAIGN. Do

Not Feed the Geese; plant a Rain Garden instead!

Do not feed the waterfowl. There are few–if any–good things that come from feeding waterfowl. Birds become dependent on handouts, become semi-domesticated, and do not migrate. This causes populations to increase and concentrate, which may create additional problems such as diseases within waterfowl populations. Goose feces are high in organic phosphorus, which can contribute to excessive algae growth in lakes. Geese that are accustomed to hand feeding may become aggressive toward other geese or even people feeding the geese. <a href="https://www.lakecountyil.gov/2425/Managing-Geese">https://www.lakecountyil.gov/2425/Managing-Geese</a>

You can help by requesting a lawn sign, planting a rain garden if you live on the lake and reminding your neighbors on the lake to help the lake by not feeding the geese.

Did you know that it is against the law to feed any migratory waterfowl per ordinance: Title 6, Police and Public Safety, 6-4-7-L?
