Public Works

'Tis the season for challenging weather conditions. Public Works staff is on call to keep our roads clear and safe during winter storms. Be courteous to the snow plow crew and please note:



- <u>Arterial streets will be plowed first</u>—for example Eastway, Burnett, Waterford Way, Hale, Carriage Hill Dr, Westridge Dr and Newport Dr.
- <u>Do not shovel, plow or blow snow into the roadway</u> as you clear you driveway.
- We will repair/replace your mailbox <u>only if the snowplow hits it directly</u>.
 You are responsible to make sure your mailbox can withstand the weight of snow from the plow.
- Stay safe at home if you don't need to go out during a storm.

Police Department

Caution: Winter Driving Ahead! As we usher in 2023, be vigilant driving in the coming inclement weather. Snow, ice and other roadway issues make caution necessary. It'll be a few months before that's behind us, so leave enough time for your trip and enough space behind the vehicle in front of you to avoid any driving issues. As always, be especially vigilant and drive safely in the residential a where pedestrians are more often present. Most of the violators we ticket are locals who either live nearby or are just cutting through as a shortcut.

Locked vehicles deter theft. It pains me to say once again, but I must *remind residents to lock their vehicles and do not, under any circumstance, leave*

the keys inside the car. Yes, it happens—and frequently. A car was even taken from an unlocked garage. Almost all of our thefts of and from motor vehicles are crimes of opportunity. Most criminals pull on the door handle and if it's locked, they move on to the next house.

No Parking on Streets Overnight or During a Snowfall. Title 7, 7-7-3 (A.7.a.) of the Village Code prohibits overnight parking between 2:00 and 6:00 a.m. Under special circumstances, however, overnight parking can be requested online. 7-7-1 A of the Code prohibits parking "When one inch or more of snow has accumulated...or when streets are in an iced or glazed condition..."

Building and Code Enforcement

<u>Updated Building Codes:</u> On 11/10/2022, The Village adopted the 2020 International and National Electrical Codes as part of our building regulations. We expect to adopt the updated State of Illinois Plumbing Code in the near future.

Building Permit Assorted Notes: Permit applications are on our website on the "Forms" tab. Permit processing takes 7-10 working days. Lead time for scheduling inspections is 24 hours. Orange permit cards must be displayed in the window for inspections to be performed. Fines apply for starting work without a permit. Permits are required for interior work that involves adding or changing location of electricity, plumbing or gas line

and for furnace replacement. If you need to do an emergency furnace replacement, we will expedite the permit. Contractors must be registered with the Village and must provide a certificate of insurance; this requirement is to protect homeowners. Note to Do-It Yourselfers: We cannot provide advice on construction. If the project is not your area of expertise, consider getting a professional.

Code Enforcement Goal Is Property Cleanup: Village officials and your neighbors want properties to be orderly and free of debris. If the property owner remedies a code violation within 14 days, no fine is collected for Citations. Common complaints are unlicensed/inoperable vehicles, and yard debris.

Parks and Lake Commission

Another Grant Award: The Parks and Lake Commission (PLC) is excited to announce we've won another Stormwater Management Grant! This grant allows us to begin the Channel Park Native Buffer Installation project, which aims to filter pollutants and sediments from stormwater runoff, decrease erosion, provide habitat for wildlife, and create a visually appealing and ecologically diverse area for people to enjoy. This project aligns with the goals of our lake study and Mutton creek study, and helps us to address important issues related to water quality and erosion in the area.

Ice Skating at Eastway Park: This winter, we will return ice skating to Eastway Park—complete with new lighting and parking improvements. Our Public Works Department will clear the rink for cooperative use on the lake; we encourage skaters to bring shovels to clear surface snow. Remember: Skating is at your own risk; follow ice safety guidelines such

as checking ice thickness, avoiding skating alone, avoiding cracks in the ice, open water and areas with slush, and having an emergency plan.

<u>Updated Signs:</u> Keep an eye out for updated fishing regulation signs and sign-board upgrades.
