## From Mayor McLaughlin

**Welcome Fall!** As you admire the natural beauty of the great outdoors, have a look at your property from the outside. Do you need to get rid of debris and give your property a facelift? Try to see our community from the eyes of prospective new neighbors and businesses. Will they want to make Island Lake their home?

**Building Projects and Contractors:** Building requirements and permit applications are on our website. Recently, a number of residents have had issues with contractors for their building projects. The building official has shut down work being done without a permit or an unregistered contractors. Permits and registrations are for your protection. *When in doubt, call the Village*.

**Slow down and obey STOP signs.** We also hear concerns from residents about speeding and running stop signs; most of the violators live in the neighborhood. Our Police Department will cite motorists for failing to obey traffic safety laws.

Respect our shared public property and facilities. Public Works and Adopt a Park volunteers work hard to take care of our parks and lake. Due to frequent vandalism, the restrooms at Converse and Veterans Parks will be locked and replaced by portable toilets. The strain on the budget and staff is only part of the cost of the damage. Morale and use of the parks suffers. Pick up after your pets. The nuisance of leaving pet waste left on public property has been increasing. It is not only a violation of the Village Code, it is disrespectful of the others who use our parks and common areas. Sadly, funds that could have been used for park improvements will be used to install trail cameras to help identify and prosecute offenders.

**Enjoy the new basketball backboards and rims** at the Village Hall court. **Remodeling of the Village offices** is nearly complete. Thanks for your patience while we make improvements to serve you better.

**Construction of Senior Lofts 55+ housing is underway.** The developer will let the Village know when they will be accepting applications for the apartments and we will post their contact information on our website. Projected occupancy: September 2024.

Economic/Business Development: Emerald Dispensary and Lounge is scheduled to open November 1, 2023. The owners will be accepting employment applications in October. Kelley's Mobil Market has purchased the property at River Rd. and Rte. 176 and is getting Department of Transportation approvals to go forward with developing the property.

**Halloween Safety:** You may see Island Lake's very own LEGO Cop on patrol on Halloween. He has some *tips to keep everyone safe* on his favorite night of the year.

- Accompany young children.
- Set time boundaries for older children and have them give you their route.
- Costumes should be made of fireproof material and should not impair vision.
- Do not allow children to have realistic replicas of firearms.
- Closely inspect treats before anyone eats them. When in doubt, throw it out.

Trick or Treat hours will be 4:00pm - 8:00pm on Halloween, Oct. 31.

Safety always: Stop means to cease moving; to come to a stand. Speed limit means the

maximum speed. Obey traffic signs or expect citations. Your safety and the safety of others is at stake—especially in the coming winter season when road conditions call for extra caution.

Parking Reminders: Parking on Village streets is prohibited from 2-6am, when 2" of snow has accumulated or when streets are in an iced or glazed condition.

## **Building and Code Enforcement**

Fall is a good season for exterior work on your home and property. Here are some reminders as you plan your repair and improvement projects.

**Permits are required for most work**. Go to our website on the forms tab to find Building Department information and forms:

www.Villageofislandlake.com/forms.

Permit processing can take up to 20 business days. Complete paperwork and a \$50 permit application fee must be submitted with the application. Make

inspection requests at *least 48* hours in advance. You must display the orange permit card in a front window for inspections to take place. Fines apply for starting work without a permit.



Code Enforcement gives residents 14 days to remedy violations to avoid fines. Respect your neighbors and your property. Property cleanup is a challenge when the snow falls. Take advantage of the final days of fine weather to spruce up your property.
